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ITEM 4 – ADVISORY BUSINESS

This Disclosure document is being offered to you by Altamira Financial Group, LLC (“AFG” or “Firm”) about the investment advisory services we provide. It discloses information about the services that we provide and the way those services are made available to you, the client.

Altamira Financial Group, LLC became registered as an Investment Advisor in November 2021. The Firm has one, main office located in Santa Fe, New Mexico. The principal owner is Kerry Lee. Kerry Lee is the Chief Compliance Officer of the Firm.

We are committed to helping clients build, manage, and preserve their wealth. Our Firm provides services that help clients to achieve their stated financial goals. We will offer initial complimentary meetings upon our discretion; however, investment advisory services are initiated only after you and AFG execute an Investment Management Agreement.

INVESTMENT MANAGEMENT AND SUPERVISION SERVICES

We manage advisory accounts on a discretionary and non-discretionary basis. For discretionary accounts, once we have determined a profile and investment plan with a client, we will execute the day-to-day transactions without seeking prior client consent but within the expected investment guidelines. Account supervision is guided by the client’s written profile and investment plan. We will accept accounts with certain trading restrictions if circumstances warrant. We primarily allocate client assets among various equities, Exchanged Traded Funds (“ETFs”), no-load or load-waived mutual funds in accordance with their stated investment objectives.

During personal discussions with clients, we determine the client’s objectives, time horizons, risk tolerance, and liquidity needs. As appropriate, we also review a client’s prior investment history, as well as family composition and background. Based on client needs, we develop a client’s personal profile and investment plan. We then create and manage the client’s investments based on that policy and plan. It is the client’s obligation to notify us immediately if circumstances have changed with respect to their goals. Once we have determined the types of investments to be included in a client’s portfolio and have allocated the assets, we provide ongoing investment review and management services. This approach requires us to periodically review client portfolios. In addition, our firm will send an invoice to the client on a quarterly basis.

With our discretionary relationship, we will make changes to the portfolio, as we deem appropriate, to meet client financial objectives. We trade these portfolios based on the combination of our market views and client objectives, using our investment process. We tailor our advisory services to meet the needs of our clients and seek to ensure that your

portfolio is managed in a manner consistent with those needs and objectives. Clients have the ability to leave standing instructions with us to refrain from investing in particular industries or invest in limited amounts of securities.

If a non-discretionary relationship is in place, calls will be placed presenting the recommendation made and only upon your authorization will any action be taken on your behalf. We do have limited authority to direct the Custodian to deduct our investment advisory fees from accounts, but only with the appropriate written authorization from clients.

Clients may engage us to advise on certain investment products that are not maintained at our Firm's recommended custodian, such as variable life insurance, annuity contracts, and assets held in employer sponsored retirement plans. Where appropriate, we provide advice about any type of held away account that is part of a client portfolio.

You are advised and are expected to understand that our past performance is not a guarantee of future results. Certain market and economic risks exist that adversely affect an account's performance. This could result in capital losses in your account.

FINANCIAL PLANNING

Through the financial planning process, our team strives to engage our clients in conversations around the family's goals, objectives, priorities, vision, and legacy – both for the near term as well as for future generations. With the unique goals and circumstances of each family in mind, our team will offer financial planning ideas and strategies to address the client's holistic financial picture, including estate, income tax, charitable, cash flow, wealth transfer, and family legacy objectives. Our team partners with our client's other advisors (CPAs, Enrolled Agents, Estate Attorneys, Insurance Brokers, etc.) to ensure a coordinated effort of all parties toward the client's stated goals. Such services include various reports on specific goals and objectives or general investment and/or planning recommendations, guidance to outside assets, and periodic updates.

Our specific services in preparing your plan may include:

- Review and clarification of your financial goals.
- Assessment of your overall financial position including cash flow, balance sheet, investment strategy, risk management, and estate planning.
- Creation of a unique plan for each goal you have, including personal and business real estate, education, retirement or financial independence, charitable giving, estate planning, business succession, and other personal goals.
- Development of a goal-oriented investment plan, with input from various advisors to our clients around tax suggestions, asset allocation, expenses, risk, and liquidity

factors for each goal. This includes IRA and qualified plans, taxable, and trust accounts that require special attention.

- Design of a risk management plan including risk tolerance, risk avoidance, mitigation, and transfer, including liquidity as well as various insurance and possible company benefits; and
- Crafting and implementation of, in conjunction with your estate and/or corporate attorneys as tax advisor, an estate plan to provide for you and/or your heirs in the event of an incapacity or death.

A written evaluation of each client's initial situation or Financial Plan is provided to the client. An annual review will be provided by the Adviser, if indicated by the Client and Adviser per the Agreement. More frequent reviews occur but are not necessarily communicated to the client unless immediate changes are recommended.

THIRD PARTY ADVISORY SERVICES

Our Firm has entered into agreements with various third-party advisers. Under these agreements, our Firm offers clients various types of programs sponsored by these advisers. All third-party investment advisers to whom AFG will refer clients will be licensed as investment advisers by their resident state and any applicable jurisdictions or registered investment advisers with the Securities and Exchange Commission.

After gathering information about a client's financial situation and investment objectives, the AFG will assist the client in selecting a particular third-party program. AFG receives compensation pursuant to its agreements with these third-party advisers for introducing clients to these third-party advisers and for certain ongoing services provided to clients.

This compensation is disclosed to the client in a separate disclosure document and is typically equal to a percentage of the investment advisory fee charged by that third-party adviser or a fixed fee. The disclosure document provided by the AFG will clearly state the fees payable to the AFG and the impact to the overall fees due to these payments.

Since compensation AFG receives may differ depending on the agreement with each third-party adviser, AFG may have an incentive to recommend one third-party advisers over another, if the compensation arrangements are more favorable. Since the independent third-party adviser may pay the fee for the investment advisory services of AFG, the fee paid to the AFG is not negotiable, under most circumstances.

Fees paid by clients to independent third-parties are established and payable in accordance with the Form ADV Part 2A or other equivalent disclosure document of each independent third-party adviser to whom AFG refers its clients, and may or may not be negotiable, as disclosed in the disclosure documents of the third-party adviser.

Clients who are referred to third-party investment advisers will receive full disclosure, including services rendered and fee schedules, at the time of the referral, by delivery of a copy of the relevant third-party adviser's Form ADV Part 2A or equivalent disclosure document at the same time as the Form ADV Part 2A or equivalent disclosure document of the AFG.

In addition, if the investment program recommended to a client is a wrap fee program the client will also receive the Schedule H or equivalent wrap fee brochure provided by the sponsor of the program. AFG will provide to each client all appropriate disclosure statements, including disclosure of solicitation fees to AFG and its advisory associates.

AFG may also recommend that certain clients authorize the active discretionary management of a portion of their assets by and/or among certain independent investment manager(s) either directly or through a wrap fee program ("Independent Manager(s)"), based upon the stated investment objectives of the client. The terms and conditions under which the client shall engage the Independent Manager(s) shall be set forth in separate written agreements between the client and Adviser and the client and the Independent Manager(s) and/or wrap fee program sponsor. AFG shall continue to render advisory services relative to the ongoing monitoring and review of account performance, for which AFG shall receive an annual advisory fee which is based upon a percentage of the market value of the assets being managed by the designated Independent Manager(s). Factors that AFG shall consider in recommending Independent Manager(s) include the client's stated investment objective(s), management style, performance, reputation, financial strength, reporting, pricing, and research. The investment management fees charged by the designated Independent Manager(s), together with the fees charged by the wrap fee program sponsor and corresponding designated broker-dealer/custodian of the client's assets, may be exclusive of, and in addition to, AFG's investment advisory fee set forth above. As discussed above, the client may incur additional fees than those charged by AFG, the designated Independent Manager(s), wrap fee program sponsor (if applicable), and corresponding broker-dealer/custodian.

In addition to AFG's written disclosure statement, the client shall also receive the written disclosure statement of the designated Independent Manager(s) and wrap fee program sponsor (if applicable). Certain Independent Manager(s) may impose more restrictive account requirements and varying billing practices than AFG. In such instances, AFG may alter its corresponding account requirements and/or billing practices to accommodate those of the Independent Manager(s) or wrap fee program sponsor. Adviser has entered into agreements with various other third-party investment advisers ("Third Party Advisory Service") for the provision of certain investment advisory services. Adviser's IARs will provide individualized advisory services to their clients through the

selection of a suitable Third-Party Advisory Service. Factors considered in the selection of a Third-Party Advisory Service include but may not be limited to: i) each individual IAR's preference for a particular Third Party Advisory Service; ii) the client's risk tolerance, goals and objectives, as well as investment experience; and, iii) the amount of the client assets available for investment. In order to assist clients in the selection of a Third-Party Advisory Service, the IAR will typically gather information from the client about the client's financial situation, investment objectives, and reasonable restrictions the client wants on the management of the account.

All securities transactions will be decided upon and executed by the Third-Party Advisory Service. Typically, the third-party investment manager will exercise discretion in the management of client accounts. Adviser and its IAR will not manage or obtain discretionary authority over the assets in accounts participating in these programs; however, clients may grant IARs the discretionary authority to hire and fire such third party managers.

Adviser's IARs will periodically review reports provided to the client. An IAR will contact the client at least annually, or more often as agreed upon with each client, to review client's financial situation and objectives, communicate information to the Third-Party Advisory Service managing the accounts as warranted, and to assist the client in understanding and evaluating the services provided by the Third-Party Advisory Service. Clients will be expected to notify IAR of any changes in their financial situation, investment objectives, or account restrictions.

LPL FINANCIAL SPONSORED ADVISORY PROGRAMS

We may provide advisory services through certain programs sponsored by LPL Financial LLC (LPL), a registered investment advisor and broker-dealer. Below is a brief description of each LPL advisory program available to our Firm. For more information regarding the LPL programs, including more information on the advisory services and fees that apply, the types of investments available in the programs and the potential conflicts of interest presented by the programs please see the program account packet (which includes the account agreement and LPL Form ADV program brochure) and the Form ADV, Part 2A of LPL or the applicable program.

SWM II ACCOUNT

Although clients do not pay a transaction charge for transactions in a SWM II account, clients should be aware that our Firm pays LPL transaction charges for those transactions. The transaction charges paid by our Firm vary based on the type of transaction (e.g., mutual fund, equity or ETF) and for mutual funds based on whether or not the mutual fund pays 12b-1 fees and/or recordkeeping fees to LPL. Transaction charges paid by the AFG for equities and ETFs are \$9. For mutual funds, the transaction charges range from \$0 to

\$26.50. Because our Firm pays the transaction charges in SWM II accounts, there is a conflict of interest in cases where the mutual fund is offered at both \$0 and \$26.50. Clients should understand that the cost to AFG of transaction charges may be a factor that our Firm considers when deciding which securities to select and how frequently to place transactions in a SWM II account.

In many instances, LPL makes available mutual funds in a SWM II account that offer various classes of shares, including shares designated as Class A Shares and shares designed for advisory programs, which can be titled, for example, as “Class I,” “institutional,” “investor,” “retail,” “service,” “administrative” or “platform” share classes (“Platform Shares”). The Platform Share class offered for a particular mutual fund in SWM II in many cases will not be the least expensive share class that the mutual fund makes available, and was selected by LPL in certain cases because the share class pays LPL compensation for the administrative and recordkeeping services LPL provides to the mutual fund. Client should understand that another financial services firm may offer the same mutual fund at a lower overall cost to the investor than is available through SWM II. In other instances, a mutual fund may offer only Class A Shares, but another similar mutual fund may be available that offers Platform Shares. Class A Shares typically pay LPL a 12b-1 fee for providing shareholder services, distribution, and marketing expenses (“brokerage-related services”) to the mutual funds. Platform Shares generally are not subject to 12b-1 fees. As a result of the different expenses of the mutual fund share classes, it is generally more expensive for a client to own Class A Shares than Platform Shares. An investor in Platform Shares will pay lower fees over time, and keep more of his or her investment returns than an investor who holds Class A Shares of the same fund.

Our Firm has a financial incentive to recommend Class A Shares in cases where both Class A and Platform Shares are available. This is a conflict of interest which might incline our Firm, consciously or unconsciously, to render advice that is not disinterested. Although the client will not be charged a transaction charge for transactions, AFG pays LPL a per transaction charge for mutual fund purchases and sales in the account. our Firm generally does not pay transaction charges for Class A Share mutual fund transactions accounts, but generally does pay transaction charges for Platform Share mutual fund transactions. The cost to our Firm of transaction charges generally may be a factor AFG considers when deciding which securities to select and whether or not to place transactions in the account.

The lack of transaction charges to our Firm for Class A Share purchases and sales, together with the fact that Platform Shares generally are less expensive for a client to own, presents a significant conflict of interest between our Firm and the client. In short, it costs our Firm less to recommend and select Class A share mutual funds than Platform shares, but

Platform shares will generally outperform Class A mutual fund shares on the basis of internal cost structure alone. Clients should understand this conflict and consider the additional indirect expenses borne as a result of the mutual fund fees when negotiating and discussing with your AFG the advisory fee for management of an account.

PERSONAL WEALTH PORTFOLIOS PROGRAM (PWP)

PWP offers clients an asset management account using asset allocation model portfolios designed by LPL. We will have discretion for selecting the asset allocation model portfolio based on client's investment objective. We will also have discretion for selecting third party money managers (PWP Advisors), mutual funds and ETFs within each asset class of the model portfolio. LPL will act as the overlay portfolio manager on all PWP accounts and will be authorized to purchase and sell on a discretionary basis mutual funds, ETFs and equity and fixed income securities.

A minimum account value of \$250,000 is required for PWP. In certain instances, LPL will permit a lower minimum account size.

MANAGER ACCESS SELECT PROGRAM

Manager Access Select provides clients access to the investment advisory services of professional portfolio management firms for the individual management of client accounts. We will assist client in identifying a third-party portfolio manager (Portfolio Manager) from a list of Portfolio Managers made available by LPL. The Portfolio Manager manages client's assets on a discretionary basis. Our Firm will provide initial and ongoing assistance regarding the Portfolio Manager selection process.

A minimum account value of \$50,000 is required for Manager Access Select, however, in certain instances, the minimum account size may be lower or higher.

MODEL WEALTH PORTFOLIOS PROGRAM (MWP)

MWP offers clients a professionally managed mutual fund asset allocation program. Our Firm will obtain the necessary financial data from the client, assist the client in determining the suitability of the MWP program and assist the client in setting an appropriate investment objective. We will initiate the steps necessary to open an MWP account and have discretion to select a model portfolio designed by LPL's Research Department consistent with the client's stated investment objective. LPL's Research Department or third-party portfolio strategists are responsible for selecting the mutual funds or ETFs within a model portfolio and for making changes to the mutual funds or ETFs selected.

The client will authorize LPL to act on a discretionary basis to purchase and sell mutual funds and ETFs and to liquidate previously purchased securities. The client will also authorize LPL to effect rebalancing for MWP accounts.

MWP requires a minimum asset value for a program account to be managed. The minimums vary depending on the portfolio(s) selected and the account's allocation amongst portfolios. The lowest minimum for a portfolio is \$25,000. In certain instances, a lower minimum for a portfolio is permitted.

CONSULTING SERVICES

We also provide clients investment advice on a more-limited basis on one or more isolated areas of concern such as estate planning, real estate, retirement planning, or any other specific topic. Additionally, we provide advice on non-securities matters about the rendering of estate planning, insurance, real estate, and/or annuity advice or any other business advisory / consulting services for equity or debt investments in privately held businesses. In these cases, clients will be required to select their own investment managers, custodian, and/or insurance companies for the implementation of consulting recommendations. If client needs include brokerage and/or other financial services, we will recommend the use of one of several investment managers, brokers, banks, custodians, insurance companies, or other financial professionals ("Firms"). Consulting clients must independently evaluate these Firms before opening an account or transacting business and have the right to effect business through any firm they choose. Clients have the right to choose whether or not to follow the consulting advice provided.

RETIREMENT PLAN ADVISORY SERVICES

Retirement Plan Advisory Services consists of helping employer plan sponsors to establish, monitor and review their company's retirement plan. As the needs of the plan sponsor dictate, areas of advising could include investment selection and monitoring, plan structure, and participant education.

Pursuant to Section 402(c)(3) of ERISA, the client may appoint us as the Plan's "investment manager" with respect to the Plan's portfolio of investment options. We acknowledge that we are registered as an investment adviser under the SEC. Our firm acts as a "fiduciary" within the meaning of Section 3(21) and 3(38) of ERISA with respect to the Plan. We offer advisory services to employer sponsored retirement plans such as 401(k), 457, & 403(b). On the plan level, we manage the investment line-up making changes as necessary as well as providing risk-based investment models for the participants. On the individual participant level, we manage risk-based models using the current investment lineup based on risk tolerance of the individual investor. For employer-sponsored retirement plans with

participant-directed investments, our firm provides its advisory services as an investment advisor as defined under Section 3(21) of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974, as amended (“ERISA”).

When serving as an ERISA 3(21) investment adviser, the Plan Sponsor and our Firm share fiduciary responsibility. The Plan Sponsor retains ultimate decision-making authority for the investments and may accept or reject the recommendations in accordance with the terms of a separate ERISA 3(21) Plan Sponsor Investment Management Agreement between our Firm and the Plan Sponsor. Under the 3(21) agreement, our Firm can provide the following services to the Plan Sponsor:

- **Review or Development of an Investment Policy Statement**
- **Perform Due Diligence on Money Managers**
- **Provide Initial Investment and Management Selection** - Our Firm typically uses mutual funds/managed accounts/collective trusts/cash equivalents to structure portfolios designed to meet client objectives and risk profiles.
- **Provide ongoing Performance Evaluation and Monitoring of Money Managers**
- **Make Investment Recommendations when necessary**
- **Retirement Plan Services Analysis** - Our Firm will conduct an analysis of a client’s retirement plan to evaluate the services currently provided to the client by third parties. The areas of analysis may include asset management services, record keeping, administration, customer service, participant education, etc. These services may also include a cost/benefit analysis, recommendation of alternative vendors, facilitation of the RFP process for solicitation of a new vendor, and/or assistance in fee negotiations with proposed vendors.
- **Provide Employee Education Services** - Our Firm will provide enrollment and educational services the content of the program will be generic in nature.

When serving as a result of the 3(38) appointment, we are granted full trading authority over the Plan and have the responsibility for the selection and monitoring of all investment options offered under the Plan in accordance with the investment policy statement and its underlying investment objectives and strategies for the Plan. Plan participants have the ability to exercise control over the investment selection from the plans line up of investments, and we have no authority or discretion to direct the investment of assets of any participant’s account under the Plan.

Disclosure Regarding Rollover Recommendations

We are fiduciaries and when we provide investment advice to you regarding your retirement plan account or individual retirement account, we are also fiduciaries within the meaning of Title I of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act and/or the Internal

Revenue Code, as applicable, which are laws governing retirement accounts. We have to act in your best interest and not put our interest ahead of yours. At the same time, the way we make money creates some conflicts with your interests.

A client or prospect leaving an employer typically has four options regarding an existing retirement plan (and may engage in a combination of these options): (i) leave the money in the former employer's plan, if permitted, (ii) roll over the assets to the new employer's plan, if one is available and rollovers are permitted, (iii) rollover to an Individual Retirement Account ("IRA"), or (iv) cash out the account value (which could, depending upon the client's age, result in adverse tax consequences). Our Firm may recommend an investor roll over plan assets to an IRA for which our Firm provides investment advisory services. As a result, our Firm and its representatives may earn an asset-based fee. In contrast, a recommendation that a client or prospective client leave their plan assets with their previous employer or roll over the assets to a plan sponsored by a new employer will generally result in no compensation to our Firm. Our Firm therefore has an economic incentive to encourage a client to roll plan assets into an IRA that our Firm will manage, which presents a conflict of interest. To mitigate the conflict of interest, there are various factors that our Firm will consider before recommending a rollover, including but not limited to: (i) the investment options available in the plan versus the investment options available in an IRA, (ii) fees and expenses in the plan versus the fees and expenses in an IRA, (iii) the services and responsiveness of the plan's investment professionals versus those of our Firm, (iv) protection of assets from creditors and legal judgments, (v) required minimum distributions and age considerations, and (vi) employer stock tax consequences, if any. Our Firm's Chief Compliance Officer remains available to address any questions that a client or prospective client has regarding the oversight.

WRAP FEE PROGRAM

We also provide services on a wrap fee basis as part of a wrap fee program. A wrap fee program is an arrangement where brokerage commissions and transaction costs are absorbed by the Firm. The fee covers transaction costs or commissions resulting from the management of your accounts, however, most investments trade without transaction fees today, so our payment of these and other incidental custodial related expenses should not be considered a significant factor in determining the relative value of our wrap program. Participants in the Program may pay a higher aggregate fee than if brokerage services are purchased separately. Additional information about the Program is available in AFG's Wrap Brochure, which appears as Part 2A Appendix 1 of the Firm's Form ADV. Our "wrap" fee may be more or less than the fees and commissions charged by other advisory firms, third-party managers, and brokerage firms if the services were acquired separately. The factors

that bear upon the cost of services are the size of the account, type of transaction and whether trades are placed through a brokerage firm other than the custodian resulting in per trade commissions being charged.

ASSETS

As of February 15, 2022, the firm has a total of \$91,322,196 assets under management. The Firm has \$91,322,196 of discretionary assets under management and \$0 of non-discretionary assets under management.

ITEM 5 - FEES AND COMPENSATION

INVESTMENT MANAGEMENT FEES AND COMPENSATION

AFG charges a fee as compensation for providing Investment Management services on your account. These services include advisory and consulting services, trade entry, investment supervision, and other account-maintenance activities. Our recommended custodian charges transaction costs, custodial fees, redemption fees, retirement plan and administrative fees or commissions. See Additional Fees and Expenses below for additional details.

The fees for portfolio management are based on an annual percentage of assets under management and are applied to the account asset value on a pro-rata basis and billed quarterly in advance on a three-month billing cycle. Only the initial fee will be in arrears and based upon the date the account is accepted for management by execution of the advisory agreement by AFG or when the assets are transferred through a three month-billing cycle. The market value will be determined as reported by the Custodian. Fees are assessed on all assets under management. Cash and money market balances are included in the billing of the advisory fees, unless otherwise noted and agreed to in the executed Agreement. Additional deposits and withdrawals will be added or subtracted from the assets in a prorated basis to adjust the account fee. Our firm will send an invoice to you on a quarterly basis itemizing the fee, the formula used to calculate the fee, the amount of assets under management the fee is based on, and the time period covered by the fee.

Our maximum annual advisory fee is for accounts paying a percentage of assets under management is 2.50%. The specific advisory fees are set forth in your Investment Advisory Agreement. Fees may vary based on the size of the account, complexity of the portfolio, extent of activity in the account or other reasons agreed upon by us and you as the client. In certain circumstances, our fees and the timing of the fee payments may be negotiated. Our employees and their family related accounts are charged a reduced fee for our services.

Advanced billing is done on a three-month billing period and is the primary way fees are assessed in advisory accounts. To calculate advanced billing AFG assumes a 360-day year and quarters lasting 90 days. Calculations are as follows:

$$[(\text{Last day of three-month billing period} \times \text{Advisory Fee}) / 360] \times 90 \text{ days} = \text{Advance Billing}$$

As part of this process, the client is made aware of the following:

- a. You provide written authorization permitting us to be paid directly from the managed account held by the independent custodian;
- b. Our firm sends an electronic request to the custodian indicating the amount of the fee to be paid from the client's managed account;
- c. Your independent custodian offers statements at least monthly to you showing the market values for each security included in the Assets and all disbursements in your account including the amount of the advisory fees paid to us.
- d. We will send an invoice reflecting account deductions directly to clients.

Unless otherwise instructed by the client, we will aggregate asset amounts in accounts from your same household together to determine the advisory fee for all your accounts. We would do this, for example, where we also service accounts on behalf of your minor children, individual and joint accounts for a spouse, and/or other types of related accounts. This consolidation practice is designed to allow you the benefit of an increased asset total, which could cause your account(s) to be assessed a lower advisory fee.

The independent qualified custodian holding your funds and securities will debit your account directly for the advisory fee and pay that fee to us. You will provide written authorization permitting the fees to be paid directly from your account held by the qualified custodian. Further, the qualified custodian agrees to deliver an account statement quarterly directly to you indicating all the amounts deducted from the account including our advisory fees. At our discretion, our Firm will allow advisory fees to be paid by check as indicated in the Investment Advisory Agreement. You are encouraged to review your account statements for accuracy.

Either AFG or you may terminate the management agreement immediately upon written notice to the other party. The management fee will be pro-rated to the date of termination, for the billing period in which the cancellation notice was given and refunded to your account. Upon termination, you are responsible for monitoring the securities in your account, and we will have no further obligation to act or advise with respect to those assets. In the event of client's death or disability, AFG will continue management of the account

until we are notified of client's death or disability and given alternative instructions by an authorized party.

LPL has made available a no-transaction-fee (NTF) mutual fund network. This network of funds will make only one share class available for specific fund families. When NTF funds are purchased in SWM account, there are no transaction charge assessed to the client or advisor. Sponsors of mutual funds in the NTF network pay LPL compensation to participate in the NTF network. Not all share classes or funds within a fund family may be available at NTF. When NTF funds are redeemed, the transaction costs are waived. Please read the prospectus carefully before investing. There are some exceptions where LPL will continue to offer an additional share class at \$26.50, depending on the expense of the fund and minimums instituted by the fund company. Clients should be aware that advisors may be more likely to recommend funds that are participants in the NTF network. Please ask your IAR for current details. A complete list of mutual fund sponsors participating in the SWM NTF Program can be found by visiting <https://lplfinancial.lpl.com/disclosures.html>.

LPL Financial offers a trading platform with select exchange traded funds ("ETFs") that do not charge transaction fees. The no-transaction-fee ETF trading platform is available to clients participating in LPL Financial's Strategic Wealth Management ("SWM") program. Clients will be subject to transaction fees charged by LPL Financial for ETFs not included in LPL Financial's platform and for other types of securities. The limited number of ETFs available on LPL Financial's no-transaction fee platform may have higher overall expenses than other types of securities and ETFs not included in the platform. Other major custodians have eliminated transaction fees for all ETFs and U.S. listed equities, so clients may pay more for investing in the same securities at LPL Financial.

In no case are AFG fees based on, or related to, the performance of your funds or investments. You should be aware that lower fees for comparable services may be available from other sources.

FINANCIAL PLANNING FEES

In most cases, our Investment Management fees listed above include our financial planning services. For stand-alone financial planning services, our Firm will bill an hourly fee. Fees may vary based on the extent and complexity of your individual or family circumstances and the amount of your assets under our management. Our fee will be agreed in advance of services being performed. The fee will be determined based on factors including the complexity of your financial situation, agreed upon deliverables, and whether you intend to implement any recommendations through AFG. Hourly fees are \$200/hour. The specific fee for your financial plan will be discussed with you and specified in your planning agreement with AFG.

Typically, we complete a plan within a month and will present it to you within 90 days of the contract date, if you have provided us all information needed to prepare the financial plan. Fees are billed and payable at the time the financial plan is delivered to you.

If you choose to terminate the financial planning agreement by providing us with written notice. Upon termination, fees will be prorated to the date of termination and any earned portion of the fee will be billed to you based on the hours that our firm has spent on creating your financial plan prior to termination. The hourly rate used for this purpose is \$200/hour. The hourly rate would be stated in your executed Financial Planning Agreement.

We will not require prepayment of more than \$500 in fees per client, six (6) or more months in advance of providing any services. In no case are our fees based on, or related to, the performance of your funds or investments. You should be aware that lower fees for comparable services may be available from other sources.

THIRD PARTY MANAGER FEES

Compensation generally, consists of three elements: i) management and advisory fees shared by the Third-Party Advisory Services, Adviser, and its IARs; ii) transaction costs – if applicable – which may be paid to purchase and sell such securities; and iii) custody fees.

A complete description of the programs and services provided, the amount of total fees, the payment structure, termination provisions and other aspects of each program are detailed and disclosed in: i) the Third Party Investment Advisory Service's from ADV Part II; ii) the program wrap brochure (if applicable) or other applicable disclosure documents; iii) the disclosure documents of the portfolio manager or managers selected; or, iv) the Third Party Advisory Service's account opening documents. A copy of all relevant disclosure documents of the Third-Party Advisory Services and the individual portfolio manager(s) will be provided to anyone interested in these programs / managers.

For those clients that require an enhanced and/or specialized level of asset management services, AFG may also recommend that certain clients authorize the active discretionary management of a portion of their assets by and/or among certain independent investment manager(s) and/or investment programs (the "Independent Manager(s)"), based upon the stated investment objectives of the client, including investment managers and/or programs selected and/or recommended by Adviser. The terms and conditions under which the client shall engage Independent Manager(s) shall be set forth in separate written agreements between the client and AFG and the client and the designated Independent Manager(s). AFG shall continue to render advisory services to the client relative to the ongoing monitoring and reviewing of account performance, for which Adviser shall receive an annual advisory fee which is based upon a percentage of the market value of the assets

being managed by the designated Independent Manager(s). Factors which AFG shall consider in recommending Independent Manager(s) include the client's stated investment objective(s), management style, performance, reputation, financial strength, reporting, pricing, and research. The investment management fees charged by the designated Independent Manager(s) are exclusive of, and in addition to, Adviser's investment advisory fee set forth above. In addition to the fees charged by AFG, the designated Independent Manager(s) and corresponding broker-dealer/custodian, the client, relative to any mutual fund purchases, shall incur charges imposed at the mutual fund level (i.e. advisory fees and other fund expenses).

FEES FOR LPL ADVISORY PROGRAMS

The account fee charged to the client for each LPL advisory program is negotiable, subject to the following maximum account fees:

¹ The MWP/PWP account fee consists of an LPL program fee, a strategist fee (if applicable) and an advisor fee of up to 2.00%. See the MWP/PWP program brochure for more information.

However, if users decide to implement sample recommendations by executing trades, they will be charged fees, commissions, or expenses by the applicable broker or adviser, as well as underlying investment fees and expenses. Account fees are payable quarterly in advance.

AFG and LPL may share in the account fee and other fees associated with program accounts. Associated persons of AFG may also be registered representatives of LPL.

RETIREMENT PLAN SERVICES

For Retirement Plan Advisory Services compensation, we charge an advisory fee as negotiated with the Plan Sponsor and as disclosed in the Employer Sponsored Retirement Plans Consulting Agreement ("Plan Sponsor Agreement"). Our maximum advisory fees do not exceed 1.25% annually.

Typically, the billing period for these fees are paid quarterly. This fee is generally negotiable, but terms and advisory fee is agreed to in advance and acknowledged by the Plan Sponsor through the Plan Sponsor Agreement and/or Plan Provider's account agreement. Fee billing methods vary depending on the Plan Provider.

Either our Firm or the Plan Sponsor may terminate the Agreement upon 30 days written notice to the other party. The Plan Sponsor is responsible to pay for services rendered until the termination of the Agreement.

CONSULTING

AFG provides hourly planning services for clients who need advice on a limited scope of work. AFG will negotiate consulting fees with you. Fees may vary based on the extent and complexity of the consulting project. The hourly rate for limited scope engagements is \$200. You will be billed monthly as services are rendered.

Either party may terminate the agreement. Upon termination, fees will be prorated to the date of termination and any unearned portion of the fee will be refunded to you as described above. You should be aware that lower fees for comparable services may be available from other sources.

ADMINISTRATIVE SERVICES

Our Firm utilizes a third party and technology platform to support data reconciliation, performance reporting, fee calculation and billing, research, client database maintenance, quarterly performance evaluations, payable reports, web site administration, models, trading platforms, and other functions related to the administrative tasks of managing client accounts. Due to this arrangement, the third-party vendor will have access to client information, but will not serve as an investment advisor to our clients. AFG and this third party are non-affiliated companies. This third party charges our Firm an annual fee for each account administered by the third party. The annual fee is paid from the portion of the management fee retained by us.

ADDITIONAL FEES AND EXPENSES

In addition to the advisory fees paid to our Firm, clients also incur certain charges imposed by other third parties, such as broker-dealers, custodians, trust companies, banks, and other financial institutions (collectively “Financial Institutions”). These additional charges include custodial fees, charges imposed by a mutual fund or ETF in a client’s account, as disclosed in the fund’s prospectus (e.g., fund management fees and other fund expenses), deferred sales charges, odd-lot differentials, transfer taxes, wire transfer and electronic fund fees, regulatory fees and other fees and taxes on brokerage accounts and securities transactions. Our brokerage practices are described at length in Item 12, below.

Certain investment adviser representatives of our Firm are also associated with LPL Financial as broker-dealer registered representatives (“Dually Registered Persons”). In their capacity as registered representatives of LPL Financial, certain Dually Registered Persons may earn commissions for the sale of securities or investment products that they

recommend for brokerage clients. They do not earn commissions on the sale of securities or investment products recommended or purchased in advisory accounts through AFG. Clients have the option of purchasing many of the securities and investment products we make available to you through another broker-dealer or investment adviser. However, when purchasing these securities and investment products away from our Firm, you will not receive the benefit of the advice and other services we provide.

ITEM 6 - PERFORMANCE BASED FEES AND SIDE-BY-SIDE MANAGEMENT

Our Firm does not engage in performance-based fees. No supervised person is compensated by performance-based fees. Performance-based fees may create an incentive for the advisor to recommend an investment that may carry a higher degree of risk.

ITEM 7 - TYPES OF CLIENTS

Our Firm works with the following types of clients: individuals, high net-worth individuals, foundations, employer sponsored retirement plans, charitable organizations, institutions, trusts and estates.

We impose a \$25,000 minimum account value to initiate our Firm's advisory and money management services, however, this may be waived as deemed appropriate by the Firm.

ITEM 8 - METHODS OF ANALYSIS, INVESTMENT STRATEGIES AND RISK OF LOSS

While there may be some similarities in the portfolios created by Altamira Financial Group, LLC, we understand that every client has their own unique planning needs. We have the ability and flexibility to create portfolios to help our client achieve their goals. We may utilize the following forms of analysis:

- **Fundamental Analysis:** We attempt to measure the intrinsic value of a security by looking at economic and financial factors (including the overall economy, industry conditions, and the financial condition and management of the company itself) to determine if the company is underpriced (indicating it may be a good time to buy) or overpriced (indicating it may be time to sell). Fundamental analysis does not attempt to anticipate market movements. This presents a potential risk, as the price of a security can move up or down along with the overall market regardless of the economic and financial factors considered in evaluating the stock.
- **Quantitative Analysis:** We use mathematical ratios and other performance appraisal methods in attempt to obtain more accurate measurements of a model manager's investment acumen, idea generation, consistency of purpose and overall ability to outperform their stated benchmark throughout a full market cycle.

Additionally, we perform periodic measurements to assess the authenticity of returns. A risk in using quantitative analysis is that the models used may be based on assumptions that prove to be incorrect.

- **Technical Analysis:** We use this method of evaluating securities by analyzing statistics generated by market activity, such as past prices and volume. Technical analysts do not attempt to measure a security's intrinsic value, but instead use charts and other tools to identify patterns that can suggest future activity. Technical analysts believe that the historical performance of stocks and markets are indications of future performance. Technical analysis is even more subjective than fundamental analysis in that it relies on proper interpretation of a given security's price and trading volume data. A decision might be made based on a historical move in a certain direction that was accompanied by heavy volume; however, that heavy volume may only be heavy relative to past volume for the security in question, but not compared to the future trading volume. Therefore, there is the risk of a trading decision being made incorrectly, since future trading volume is an unknown. Technical analysis is also done through observation of various market sentiment readings, many of which are quantitative. Market sentiment gauges the relative degree of bullishness and bearishness in a given security, and a contrarian investor utilizes such sentiment advantageously. When most traders are bullish, then there are very few traders left in a position to buy the security in question, so it becomes advantageous to sell it ahead of the crowd. When most traders are bearish, then there are very few traders left in a position to sell the security in question, so it becomes advantageous to buy it ahead of the crowd. The risk in utilization of such sentiment technical measures is that a very bullish reading can always become more bullish, resulting in lost opportunity if the money manager chooses to act upon the bullish signal by selling out of a position. The reverse is also true in that a bearish reading of sentiment can always become more bearish, which may result in a premature purchase of a security.
- **Asset Allocation:** Rather than focusing primarily on securities selection, we attempt to identify an appropriate ratio of securities, fixed income, and cash suitable to the client's investment goals and risk tolerance. A risk of asset allocation is that the client may not participate in sharp increases in a particular security, industry or market sector. Another risk is that the ratio of securities, fixed income, and cash will change over time due to stock and market movements and, if not corrected, will no longer be appropriate for the client's goals.
- **Mutual Fund and/or ETF Analysis:** We look at the experience and track record of the manager of the mutual fund or ETF in attempt to determine if that manager has demonstrated an ability to invest over a period of time and in different

economic conditions. We also monitor the funds or ETFs in attempt to determine if they are continuing to follow their stated investment strategy.

A risk of mutual fund and/or ETF analysis is that, as in all securities investments, past performance does not guarantee future results. A manager who has been successful may not be able to replicate that success in the future. In addition, as we do not control the underlying investments in a fund or ETF, managers of different funds held by the client may purchase the same security, increasing the risk to the client if that security were to fall in value. There is also a risk that a manager may deviate from the stated investment mandate or strategy of the fund or ETF, which could make the holding(s) less suitable for the client's portfolio.

- **Model Manager Analysis:** We examine the experience, expertise, investment philosophies, and past performance of Model Managers in attempt to determine if that manager has demonstrated an ability to invest over a period of time and in different economic conditions. We monitor the manager's underlying holdings, strategies, concentrations and leverage as part of our overall periodic risk assessment. Additionally, as part of our due-diligence process, we survey the Model Manager's compliance and business enterprise risks.

RISK OF LOSS

A client's investment portfolio is affected by general economic and market conditions, such as interest rates, availability of credit, inflation rates, economic conditions, changes in laws and national and international political circumstances.

Investing in securities involve certain investment risks. Securities may fluctuate in value or lose value. Clients should be prepared to bear the potential risk of loss. AFG will assist Clients in determining an appropriate strategy based on their tolerance for risk.

Each Client engagement will entail a review of the Client's investment goals, financial situation, time horizon, tolerance for risk and other factors to develop an appropriate strategy for managing a Client's account. Client participation in this process, including full and accurate disclosure of requested information, is essential for the analysis of a Client's account(s). AFG shall rely on the financial and other information provided by the Client or their designees without the duty or obligation to validate the accuracy and completeness of the provided information. It is the responsibility of the Client to inform AFG of any changes in financial condition, goals or other factors that may affect this analysis.

Our methods rely on the assumption that the underlying companies within our security allocations are accurately reviewed by the rating agencies and other publicly available sources of information about these securities, are providing accurate and unbiased data.

While we are alert to indications that data may be incorrect, there is always a risk that our analysis may be compromised by inaccurate or misleading information.

Investors should be aware that accounts are subject to the following risks:

- **MARKET RISK** - Even a long-term investment approach cannot guarantee a profit. Economic, political, and issuer-specific events will cause the value of securities to rise or fall. Because the value of investment portfolios will fluctuate, there is the risk that you will lose money and your investment may be worth more or less upon liquidation.
- **FOREIGN SECURITIES AND CURRENCY RISK** - Investments in international and emerging-market securities include exposure to risks such as currency fluctuations, foreign taxes and regulations, and the potential for illiquid markets and political instability.
- **CAPITALIZATION RISK** - Small-cap and mid-cap companies may be hindered as a result of limited resources or less diverse products or services. Their stocks have historically been more volatile than the stocks of larger, more established companies.
- **INTEREST RATE RISK** - In a rising rate environment, the value of fixed-income securities generally declines, and the value of equity securities may be adversely affected.
- **CREDIT RISK** - Credit risk is the risk that the issuer of a security may be unable to make interest payments and/or repay principal when due. A downgrade to an issuer's credit rating or a perceived change in an issuer's financial strength may affect a security's value and thus, impact the fund's performance.
- **SECURITIES LENDING RISK** - Securities lending involves the risk that the fund loses money because the borrower fails to return the securities in a timely manner or at all. The fund could also lose money if the value of the collateral provided for loaned securities, or the value of the investments made with the cash collateral, falls. These events could also trigger adverse tax consequences for the fund.
- **EXCHANGE-TRADED FUNDS** - ETFs face market-trading risks, including the potential lack of an active market for shares, losses from trading in the secondary markets, and disruption in the creation/redemption process of the ETF. Any of these factors may lead to the fund's shares trading at either a premium or a discount to its "net asset value."
- **PERFORMANCE OF UNDERLYING MANAGERS** - We select the mutual funds and ETFs in the asset allocation portfolios. However, we depend on the manager of such funds to select individual investments in accordance with their stated investment strategy.
- **CYBERSECURITY RISK** - In addition to the Material Investment Risks listed above, investing involves various operational and "cybersecurity" risks. These risks include both intentional and unintentional events at our firm or one of its third-party counterparties or service providers, that may result in a loss or corruption of data, result in the unauthorized release or other misuse of confidential information, and generally compromise our Firm's ability to conduct its business. A cybersecurity breach may also result in a third-party

obtaining unauthorized access to our clients' information, including social security numbers, home addresses, account numbers, account balances, and account holdings. Our Firm has established business continuity plans and risk management systems designed to reduce the risks associated with cybersecurity breaches. However, there are inherent limitations in these plans and systems, including that certain risks may not have been identified, in large part because different or unknown threats may emerge in the future. As such, there is no guarantee that such efforts will succeed, especially because our Firm does not directly control the cybersecurity systems of our third-party service providers. There is also a risk that cybersecurity breaches may not be detected.

- **STRUCTURED NOTES** - Structured products are designed to facilitate highly customized risk-return objectives. While structured products come in many different forms, they typically consist of a debt security that is structured to make interest and principal payments based upon various assets, rates, or formulas. Many structured products include an embedded derivative component. Structured products may be structured in the form of a security, in which case these products may receive benefits provided under federal securities law, or they may be cast as derivatives, in which case they are offered in the over-the-counter market and are subject to no regulation. Investment in structured products includes significant risks, including valuation, liquidity, price, credit, and market risks. One common risk associated with structured products is a relative lack of liquidity due to the highly customized nature of the investment. Moreover, the full extent of returns from the complex performance features is often not realized until maturity. As such, structured products tend to be more of a buy-and-hold investment decision rather than a means of getting in and out of a position with speed and efficiency. Another risk with structured products is the credit quality of the issuer. Although the cash flows are derived from other sources, the products themselves are legally considered to be the issuing financial institution's liabilities. The vast majority of structured products are from high-investment-grade issuers only. Also, there is a lack of pricing transparency. There is no uniform standard for pricing, making it harder to compare the net-of-pricing attractiveness of alternative structured product offerings than it is, for instance, to compare the net expense ratios of different mutual funds or commissions among broker-dealers.
- **NON-LIQUID ALTERNATIVE INVESTMENTS** - From time to time, our Firm will recommend to certain qualifying clients that a portion of such clients' assets be invested in private funds, private fund-of-funds and/or other alternative investments (collectively, "Nonliquid Alternative Investments"). Nonliquid Alternative Investments are not suitable for all of our Firm's clients and are offered only to those qualifying clients for whom our Firm believes such an investment is suitable and in line with their overall investment strategy. Nonliquid Alternative Investments typically are available to only a limited number of sophisticated investors who meet the definition of "accredited investor" under Regulation D of the Securities Act of 1933, as amended (the "Securities Act"), or "qualified client" under the Investment Advisers Act of 1940, or "qualified purchaser" under the Investment Company Act of 1940. Nonliquid Alternative Investments present special risks for our Firm's clients, including without limitation, limited liquidity, higher fees and

expenses, volatile performance, no assurance of investment returns, heightened risk of loss, limited transparency, additional reliance on underlying management of the investment, special tax considerations, subjective valuations, use of leverage and limited regulatory oversight. When a Nonliquid Alternative Investment invests part or all of its assets in real estate properties, there are additional risks that are unique to real estate investing, including but not limited to: limitations of the appraisal value; the borrower's financial conditions (if the underlying property has been obtained by a loan), including the risk of foreclosures on the property; neighborhood values; the supply of and demand for properties of like kind; and certain city, state and/or federal regulations. Additionally, real estate investing is also subject to possible loss due to uninsured losses from natural and man-made disasters. The above list is not exhaustive of all risks related to an investment in Nonliquid Alternative Investments. A more comprehensive discussion of the risks associated with a particular Nonliquid Investment is set forth in that fund's offering documents, which will be provided to each client subscribing to a Nonliquid Alternative Investment, for review and consideration. It is important that each potential, qualified investor carefully read each offering or private placement memorandum prior to investing.

ITEM 9 - DISCIPLINARY INFORMATION

We do not have any legal, financial or other "disciplinary" item to report.

ITEM 10 - OTHER FINANCIAL INDUSTRY ACTIVITIES AND AFFILIATIONS

INSURANCE

Some of our IARs are also licensed insurance agents and sell various life insurance products, long term care and fixed and variable annuities. Our IARs receive compensation (commissions, trails, or other compensation from the respective product sponsors) as a result of effecting insurance transactions for clients. A portion of the time IARs spend (generally 10%) is in connection with these insurance activities and it represents 10% of the ongoing revenue for our IARs. The advisor has an incentive to recommend insurance and this incentive creates a conflict of interest between your interests and our Firm. Clients should note that they have the right to decide whether or not to engage the services of our IARs. Further, clients should note they have the right to decide whether to act on the recommendations and the right to choose any professional to execute the advice for any insurance products through our IAR or any licensed insurance agent not affiliated with our Firm. We recognize the fiduciary responsibility to place your interests first and have established policies in this regard to avoid any conflicts of interest.

BROKER DEALER

AFG is not a broker/dealer, but our Investment Adviser Representatives ("IAR") are registered representatives of LPL Financial, LLC ("LPL"), a full-service broker-dealer,

member FINRA/SIPC, which compensates them for effecting securities transactions. When placing securities transactions through LPL in their capacity as registered representatives, they may earn sales commissions. Because the IARs are dually registered with LPL and AFG, LPL has certain supervisory and administrative duties pursuant to the requirements of FINRA Conduct Rule 3040. LPL and AFG are not affiliated companies. IARs of AFG spend a portion their time in connection with broker/dealer activities.

As a broker-dealer, LPL engages in a broad range of activities normally associated with securities brokerage firms. Pursuant to the investment advice given by AFG or its IARs, investments in securities may be recommended for clients. If LPL is selected as the broker-dealer, LPL and its registered representatives, including IARs of AFG, may receive commissions for executing securities transactions.

You are advised that if LPL is selected as the broker-dealer, the transaction charges may be higher or lower than the charges you may pay if the transactions were executed at other broker/dealers. You should note, however, that you are under no obligation to purchase securities through IARs of AFG or LPL.

Moreover, you should note that under the rules and regulations of FINRA, LPL has an obligation to maintain certain client records and perform other functions regarding certain aspects of the investment advisory activities of its registered representatives. These obligations require LPL to coordinate with and have the cooperation of its registered representatives that operate as, or are otherwise associated with, investment advisers other than LPL. Accordingly, LPL may limit the use of certain custodial and brokerage arrangements available to clients of AFG and LPL may collect, as paying agent of AFG, the investment advisory fee remitted to AFG by the account custodian. LPL may charge an administrative Fee to the Firm. This charge will not increase the advisory fee you have agreed to pay AFG.

IARs of AFG, in their capacity as registered representatives of LPL, or as agents appointed with various life, disability or other insurance companies, receive commissions, 12(b)-1 fees, fee trails, or other compensation from the respective product sponsors and/or as a result of effecting securities transactions for clients. However, clients should note that they have the right to decide whether or not to purchase any investment products through AFG's representatives.

OTHER AFFILIATIONS

Additionally, management personnel of AFG may engage in outside business activities. As such, these individuals can receive separate, yet customary commission compensation resulting from implementing product transactions on behalf of investment advisory Clients. Clients are not under any obligation to engage these individuals when considering

implementation of these outside recommendations. The implementation of any or all recommendations is solely at the discretion of the Client.

Our Firm does not have an application pending to register, as a futures commission merchant, commodity pool operator, a commodity trading adviser, or an associated person of the foregoing entities.

Clients should be aware that the ability to receive additional compensation by our Firm and its management persons or employees creates conflicts of interest that impair the objectivity of the Firm and these individuals when making advisory recommendations. Our Firm endeavors at all times to put the interest of its clients first as part of our fiduciary duty as a registered investment adviser; we take the following steps, among others to address this conflict:

- we disclose to clients the existence of all material conflicts of interest, including the potential for the Firm and our employees to earn compensation from advisory clients in addition to the Firm's advisory fees.
- we disclose to clients that they have the right to decide to purchase recommended investment products from our employees.
- we collect, maintain and document accurate, complete and relevant client background information, including the client's financial goals, objectives, and liquidity needs.
- the Firm conducts regular reviews of each client advisory account to verify that all recommendations made to a client are in the best interest of the client's needs and circumstances.
- we require that our employees seek prior approval of any outside employment activity so that we may ensure that any conflicts of interests in such activities are properly addressed.
- we periodically monitor these outside employment activities to verify that any conflicts of interest continue to be properly addressed by the Firm; and
- we educate our employees regarding the responsibilities of a fiduciary, including the need for having a reasonable and independent basis for the investment advice provided to clients.

ITEM 11 - CODE OF ETHICS

Our Firm and persons associated with us are allowed to invest for their own accounts, or to have a financial investment in the same securities or other investments that we recommend or acquire for your account and may engage in transactions that are the same as or different than transactions recommended to or made for your account. This creates

a conflict of interest. We recognize the fiduciary responsibility to act in your best interest and have established policies to mitigate conflicts of interest.

We have developed and implemented a Code of Ethics that sets forth standards of conduct expected of our advisory personnel to mitigate this conflict of interest. The Code of Ethics addresses, among other things, personal trading, gifts, and the prohibition against the use of inside information.

The Code of Ethics is designed to protect our clients to detect and deter misconduct, educate personnel regarding the Firm's expectations and laws governing their conduct, remind personnel that they are in a position of trust and must act with complete propriety at all times, protect the reputation of AFG, safeguard against the violation of the securities laws, and establish procedures for personnel to follow so that we may determine whether their personnel are complying with the Firm's ethical principles.

We have established the following restrictions in order to ensure our Firm's fiduciary responsibilities:

- No supervised employee of AFG shall prefer his or her own interest to that of the advisory client. Trades for supervised employees are traded alongside client accounts.
- We maintain a list of all securities holdings of anyone associated with this advisory practice with access to advisory recommendations. These holdings are reviewed on a regular basis by an appropriate officer/individual of AFG.
- We emphasize the unrestricted right of the client to decline implementation of any advice rendered, except in situations where we are granted discretionary authority of the client's account.
- We require that all supervised employees must act in accordance with all applicable Federal and State regulations governing registered investment advisory practices.
- Any supervised employee not in observance of the above may be subject to termination.

None of our associated persons may affect for himself/herself or for accounts in which he/she holds a beneficial interest, any transactions in a security which is being actively recommended to any of our clients, unless in accordance with the Firm's procedures.

ITEM 12 - BROKERAGE PRACTICES

We have a relationship with LPL Financial ("LPL") member FINRA/SIPC to act as custodian for your account. LPL is an independent and unaffiliated SEC-registered broker-dealer. LPL

offers to independent investment Advisors services which include custody of securities, trade execution, clearance, and settlement of transactions. We may recommend that you establish accounts with LPL to maintain custody of your assets and to effect trades for your accounts. Some of the products, services and other benefits provided by LPL benefit us and may not benefit you or your account. Our recommendation/requirement that you place assets with LPL may be based in part on benefits LPL provides us, and not solely on the nature, cost or quality of custody and execution services provided by the custodian.

We are independently owned and operated and AFG is not affiliated with LPL. LPL provides us with access to their institutional trading and custody services. These services include brokerage, custody, research and access to mutual funds and other investments that are otherwise generally available only to institutional investors.

In the event you request us to recommend a broker/dealer custodian for execution and/or custodial services, we generally recommend your account to be maintained at LPL. We may recommend that you establish accounts with LPL to maintain custody of your assets and to effect trades for your accounts. You have the right to decide whether or not to act upon any recommendations, and if you elect to act upon any recommendations, you have the right to act or not act on placing the transactions through any custodian we recommend. Our recommendation is generally based on the custodian's cost and fees, skills, reputation, dependability, and compatibility with the client. You may be able to obtain lower commissions and fees from other brokers and the value of products, research and services given to us is not a factor in determining the selection of broker/dealer or the reasonableness of their commissions.

You may be able to obtain lower commissions and fees from other brokers and the value of products, research and services given to us is not a factor in determining the selection of custodian or the reasonableness of their commissions. LPL's execution quality may be different than other broker-dealers or custodians.

For our client accounts maintained in custody with one of these custodians, the custodians generally do not charge separately for custody but are compensated by account holders through 12b-1 fees and ticket charges.

Our Firm receives support services and/or products from LPL Financial, many of which assist the our Firm to better monitor and service program accounts maintained at LPL Financial; however, some of the services and products benefit us and not client accounts. These support services and/or products may be received without cost, at a discount, and/or at a negotiated rate, and may include the following:

- investment-related research
- pricing information and market data

- software and other technology that provide access to client account data
- compliance and/or practice management-related publications
- consulting services
- attendance at conferences, meetings, and other educational and/or social events
- marketing support
- computer hardware and/or software
- other products and services used by our Firm in furtherance of its investment advisory business operations

LPL Financial may provide these services and products directly or may arrange for third party vendors to provide the services or products to Advisor. In the case of third-party vendors, LPL Financial may pay for some or all of the third party's fees.

These support services are provided to our Firm based on the overall relationship between our Firm and LPL Financial. It is not the result of soft dollar arrangements or any other express arrangements with LPL Financial that involves the execution of client transactions as a condition to the receipt of services. Our Firm will continue to receive the services regardless of the volume of client transactions executed with LPL Financial. Clients do not pay more for services as a result of this arrangement. There is no corresponding commitment made by our Firm to LPL or any other entity to invest any specific amount or percentage of client assets in any specific securities as a result of the arrangement. However, because we receive these benefits from LPL Financial, there is a potential conflict of interest. The receipt of these products and services presents a financial incentive for us to recommend that its clients use LPL Financial's custodial platform rather than another custodian's platform.

Many of these services generally may be used to service all or a substantial number of our accounts. The custodians also make available to us other services intended to help us manage and further develop our business enterprise. These services may include consulting, publications and conferences on practice management, information technology, business succession, regulatory compliance, and marketing. In addition, the custodians may make available, arrange and/or pay for these services rendered to us by third parties. The custodians may discount or waive fees it would otherwise charge for some of these services or pay all or a part of the fees of a third-party providing these services to us

While as a fiduciary, we endeavor to act in your best interest, our recommendation that you maintain your assets in accounts at our recommended custodians may be based in part on the benefit to us or the availability of some of the foregoing products and services and not solely on the nature, cost or quality of custody and brokerage services provided by

the custodian, which creates a conflict of interest. IARs endeavor at all times to put the interest of our clients first as a part of their fiduciary duty.

TRADE ERRORS

We have implemented procedures designed to prevent trade errors; however, trade errors in client accounts cannot always be avoided. Consistent with our fiduciary duty, it is our policy to correct trade errors in a manner that is in the best interest of the client. In cases where the client causes the trade error, the client will be responsible for any loss resulting from the correction. Depending on the specific circumstances of the trade error, the client may not be able to receive any gains generated as a result of the error correction. In all situations where the client does not cause the trade error, the client will be made whole and we will absorb any loss resulting from the trade error if the error was caused by the firm. If the error is caused by the Custodian, the Custodian will be responsible for covering all trade error costs. If an investment gain results from the correcting trade, the gain will be donated to charity by the Custodian. Our Firm will never benefit or profit from trade errors.

BROKERAGE FOR CLIENT REFERRALS

AFG does not receive client referrals from any custodian or third party in exchange for using that custodian or third party.

AGGREGATION AND ALLOCATION OF TRANSACTIONS

We may aggregate transactions if we believe that aggregation is consistent with the duty to seek best execution for our clients and is consistent with the disclosures made to clients and terms defined in the client Investment Advisory Agreement. No advisory client will be favored over any other client, and each account that participates in an aggregated order will participate at the average share price (per custodian) for all transactions in that security on a given business day.

We will aggregate trades for ourselves or our associated persons with your trades, providing that the following conditions are met:

1. Our policy for the aggregation of transactions shall be fully disclosed separately to our existing clients (if any) and the broker/dealer(s) through which such transactions will be placed;
2. We will not aggregate transactions unless we believe that aggregation is consistent with our duty to seek the best execution (which includes the duty to seek best price) for you and is consistent with the terms of our Investment Advisory Agreement with you for which trades are being aggregated.

3. No advisory client will be favored over any other client; each client that participates in an aggregated order will participate at the average share price for all our transactions in a given security on a given business day, with transaction costs based on each client's participation in the transaction.
4. We will prepare a written statement ("Allocation Statement") specifying the participating client accounts and how to allocate the order among those clients.
5. If the aggregated order is filled in its entirety, it will be allocated among clients in accordance with the allocation statement; if the order is partially filled, the accounts that did not receive the previous trade's positions should be "first in line" to receive the next allocation.
6. Notwithstanding the foregoing, the order may be allocated on a basis different from that specified in the Allocation Statement if all client accounts receive fair and equitable treatment and the reason for difference of allocation is explained in writing and is reviewed by our compliance officer. Our books and records will separately reflect, for each client account, the orders of which aggregated, the securities held by, and bought for that account.
7. We will receive no additional compensation or remuneration of any kind because of the proposed aggregation; and
8. Individual advice and treatment will be accorded to each advisory client.

DIRECTED BROKERAGE

We do not routinely require that you direct us to execute transactions through a specified broker dealer. Additionally, we typically do not permit you to direct brokerage. We place trades for your account subject to our duty to seek best execution and other fiduciary duties.

ITEM 13 - REVIEW OF ACCOUNTS

ACCOUNT REVIEWS AND REVIEWERS – INVESTMENT SUPERVISORY SERVICES

Our Investment Adviser Representatives will monitor client accounts on a regular basis and perform annual reviews with each client. All accounts are reviewed for consistency with client investment strategy, asset allocation, risk tolerance, and performance relative to the appropriate benchmark. More frequent reviews may be triggered by changes in an account holder's personal, tax, or financial status. Geopolitical and macroeconomic specific events may also trigger reviews. You are urged to notify us of any changes in your personal circumstances.

STATEMENTS AND REPORTS

Reports from our Firm are generated for clients on an annual basis or as requested. These reports show the rate of return of accounts under management of AFG.

The custodian for the individual client's account will also provide clients with an account statement at least quarterly. You are urged to compare the reports and invoices provided by AFG against the account statements you receive directly from your account custodian.

ITEM 14 – CLIENT REFERRALS AND OTHER COMPENSATION

Our firm does not accept nor receive compensation for client referrals.

From time to time, we may receive expense reimbursement for travel and/or marketing expenses from distributors of investment and/or insurance products. Travel expense reimbursements are typically a result of attendance at due diligence and/or investment training events hosted by product sponsors. Marketing-expense reimbursements are typically the result of informal expense sharing arrangements in which product sponsors may underwrite costs incurred for marketing such as advertising, publishing and seminar expenses. Although receipt of these travel and marketing expense reimbursements are not predicated upon specific sales quotas, the product sponsor reimbursements are typically made by those sponsors for whom sales have been made or it is anticipated sales will be made.

ITEM 15 – CUSTODY

Custody, as it applies to investment advisors, has been defined by regulators as having access or control over client funds and/or securities. In other words, custody is not limited to physically holding client funds and securities. If an investment advisor has the ability to access or control client funds or securities, the investment advisor is deemed to have custody and must ensure proper procedures are implemented.

While our firm does not maintain physical custody of client assets (which are maintained by a qualified custodian, as discussed above), we are deemed to have custody of certain client assets if given the authority to withdraw assets from client accounts, as further described below under "Standing Instructions". All our clients receive account statements directly from their qualified custodian(s) at least quarterly upon opening of an account. We urge our clients to carefully review these statements. Additionally, if our firm decides to send its own account statements to clients, such statements will include a legend that recommends the client compare the account statements received from the qualified custodian with those received from our firm. Clients are encouraged to raise any questions with us about the custody, safety or security of their assets and our custodial recommendations.

AFG is deemed to have custody of client funds and securities whenever AFG is given the authority to have fees deducted directly from client accounts. However, this is the only form of custody AFG will ever maintain. It should be noted that authorization to trade in client accounts is not deemed by regulators to be custody.

Clients will provide written authorization permitting the fees to be paid directly from their account held by the qualified custodian. When fees are deducted from an account, AFG is responsible for calculating the fee and delivering instructions to the custodian. AFG will send out an invoice to the Client on a quarterly basis. You are urged to compare the reports and invoices provided by AFG against the account statements you receive directly from your account custodian.

ITEM 16 – INVESTMENT DISCRETION

For discretionary accounts, prior to engaging AFG to provide investment advisory services, you will enter a written Agreement with us granting the Firm the authority to supervise and direct, on an on-going basis, investments in accordance with the client's investment objective and guidelines. In addition, you will need to execute additional documents required by the Custodian to authorize and enable AFG, in its sole discretion, without prior consultation with or ratification by you, to purchase, sell, or exchange securities in and for your accounts. We are authorized, in our discretion and without prior consultation with you to: (1) buy, sell, exchange and trade any stocks, bonds or other securities or assets and (2) determine the amount of securities to be bought or sold, and (3) place orders with the custodian. Any limitations to such discretionary authority will be communicated to our Firm in writing by you, the client.

In some instances, we may not have discretion. We will discuss all transactions with you prior to execution or you will be required to make the trades if in an employer sponsored account.

ITEM 17 – VOTING YOUR SECURITIES

We will not vote proxies on your behalf. You are welcome to vote proxies or designate an independent third-party at your own discretion. You designate proxy voting authority in the custodial account documents. You must ensure that proxy materials are sent directly to you or your assigned third party. We do not act with respect to any securities or other investments that become the subject of any legal proceedings, including bankruptcies. Clients can contact our office with questions about a particular proxy solicitation by phone at 505-477-3334.

ITEM 18 – FINANCIAL INFORMATION

We do not require or solicit prepayment of more than \$500 in fees per client, six months or more in advance. Therefore, we are not required to include a balance sheet for our most recent fiscal year. We are not subject to a financial condition that is reasonably likely to impair our ability to meet contractual commitments to clients. Finally, we have not been the subject of a bankruptcy petition at any time.

ITEM 19 – REQUIREMENT FOR STATE REGISTERED ADVISORS

Please see Form ADV Part 2B, Item 2 regarding the formal education and business background of our IARs. Please see Form ADV Part 2B, Item 4 for information regarding the other business activity, along with the time spent of our IARs.

Our IARs have not been involved in or found liable in an arbitration claim or civil, self-regulatory organization or administrative proceeding alleging damages in excess of \$2,500, involving an investment or an investment-related business or activity; fraud, false statement(s), or omissions; theft, embezzlement, or other wrongful taking of property; bribery, forgery, counterfeiting, or extortion; or dishonest, unfair, or unethical practices. No individual from our firm has a relationship with any issuer of securities.

Our Firm maintains a written Business Continuity Plan (BCP). The BCP outlines procedures relating to an emergency or significant business disruption. Our procedures are reasonably designed to enable our Firm or any of its investment advisor representatives to meet their existing fiduciary obligations.
