I represent the Division of Enforcement ("Division") in the above-captioned matter. On July 13, 2016, the Division received additional motions from Respondent.<sup>1</sup> The Court has found Respondent to be in default "for refusing to answer the OIP." (Order Finding Respondent in Default, July 7, 2016, at 1.) Because Respondent is in default, the Court should not now entertain any additional motions from Respondent until, and unless, Respondent is able to show "good cause" why his default should be set aside. (See *Id.*, at 4-5.) The Division, therefore, respectfully requests that the Court deny Respondent's latest motions.
