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DECISIONS IN ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

**WEIS SECURITIES, INC. REVOKED;
THREE FORMER OFFICERS BARRED**

The Commission has revoked the broker-dealer registration of Weis Securities, Inc., of New York City, and barred Joel Kubie, Alan Solomon and Robert Lynn, former officers of that firm, from association with any broker or dealer.

The sanctions were based on findings that, during the period from about July 1972 to May 1973, the firm violated antifraud and recordkeeping provisions of the securities laws in that it effected sham securities transactions in order to conceal its true financial condition and net capital position and, in connection therewith, made false entries in its books and records. It was also found that Kubie, Solomon and Lynn had been convicted of crimes arising from their activities at the firm and, together with the firm, enjoined from violating antifraud, net capital, recordkeeping and reporting provisions of the securities laws.

Respondents failed to answer the charges against them and were deemed in default. (Rel. 34-11356)

**REGISTRATION DENIED TO SUMMIT EQUITIES CORP.;
ROBERT NAGLER BARRED**

The Commission has denied the application of Summit Equities Corp., of New York City, for broker-dealer registration and barred its president, Robert Nagler, from association with any broker or dealer.

The sanctions were based on findings that Nagler and a vice-president of Summit had been permanently enjoined from violations of antifraud, net capital, recordkeeping and other provisions of the securities laws. The firm and Nagler failed to appear at a hearing and were deemed in default. (Rel. 34-11358)

**ADVISORY COMMITTEE ON THE IMPLEMENTATION
OF A CENTRAL MARKET SYSTEM MEETINGS ANNOUNCED**

The SEC Advisory Committee on the Implementation of a Central Market System will conduct open meetings on May 15 and 16, 1975 at 500 North Capitol St., Washington, D.C. 20549, Room 776, beginning at 8:30 a.m. Initial notice of this rescheduled meeting was published in the Federal Register on April 21, 1975.

The summarized agenda for the meeting is as follows:

- (1) Review of status of securities legislation.
- (2) Meetings and reports of working groups on:
 - a. Displacement and the Limit Order Book (Messrs. Heller, Lovelace, McCulley, Pickard, Stone).
 - b. Access to the System (Messrs. Gardiner, Jefferies, Myers, Rohatyn, Yearley).
- (3) Review of progress on summary report.
- (4) Further work on system operating characteristics.

The Committee will also conduct open meetings on June 19 and 20, 1975 in Atlanta, Georgia. The summarized agenda for and the location of the June meetings will be

published in the Federal Register at least fifteen days prior to the date of the meetings.

COURT ENFORCEMENT ACTIONS

COMPLAINT NAMES RICHARDSON & CO., INC., OTHERS

The Los Angeles Regional Office announced that the Commission, on April 15 filed a complaint in the U.S. District Court in Los Angeles, charging T. P. Richardson & Co., Inc., doing business as Richardson & Co., Inc., a registered securities broker and dealer in Century City, Los Angeles, California, and Thomas Patrick Richardson, of Beverly Hills, California, with violations of the antifraud, net capital, and record-keeping provisions of the securities laws. In substance, the complaint alleged that the firm had been engaged in business while in an insolvent condition.

In the complaint, the Commission sought orders restraining and enjoining the defendants from committing further violations of those provisions and an order appointing a temporary and permanent receiver for the assets and operations of the defendant brokerage firm.

On April 16, the Honorable Jesse W. Curtis, District Judge, entered an order temporarily restraining the defendant Richardson & Co., Inc. from committing violations as prayed for in the complaint; and he further ordered the appointment of Eugene Bell, an attorney of Los Angeles, California, as temporary receiver pending further order of the Court. The defendant, Richardson & Co., Inc., consented to the entry of the temporary restraining order for an indefinite period and to the appointment of the temporary receiver. (SEC v. T. P. Richardson & Co., Inc. and Thomas Patrick Richardson, U.S.D.C., C.D. Cal., Civil Action No. CV-75-1302-JWC.). (LR-6846)

TOWN ENTERPRISES, INC., OTHERS ENJOINED

The Washington Regional Office announced that on April 16 the federal court in Delaware entered an order permanently enjoining Town Enterprises, Inc., Town Finance Corporation, Russell C. Mansfield, and Russell G. Mansfield, all of Wilmington, Delaware; Town Finance Corporation of Rome, Georgia; County Savings and Loan Company of Chattanooga, Chattanooga, Tennessee; Family Savings & Loan, Inc. of Huntington, West Virginia; Allstate Industrial Loan Plan, Inc. of Hodgeville, Kentucky; and County Thrift and Loan Company of Cumberland, Cumberland, Maryland, from violations of the registration provisions of the securities laws and enjoining the above subjects and Morris Plan Bank & Banking Co. of Chelsea, Chelsea, Massachusetts and The New Bedford Morris Plan Company of Tauton, Massachusetts from violations of the antifraud provisions of the securities laws. The defendants consented to the entry of the order without admitting or denying the allegations contained in the Commission's complaint.

Also on April 16, 1975, Town Enterprises, Inc., filed a voluntary petition under Chapter XI of the Bankruptcy Act seeking an arrangement with creditors. The Commission's Motion for the Appointment of a Receiver is pending. (SEC v. Town Enterprises, Inc., et al., U.S.D.C., Del., Civ. Action No. 75-85). (LR-6850)

UTAH POWER & LIGHT COMPANY
