NOTICE OF COMMISSION MEETINGS

U.S. SECURITIES AND
EXCHANGE COMMISSION

Following is a schedule of Commission meetings which will be conducted pursuant to provisions of the Government in the Sunshine Act. In general, the Commission expects to follow a schedule of holding closed meetings on Tuesdays, and open meetings on Thursday morning. Meetings on Wednesday, and if necessary on Thursday afternoons, will be either open or closed according to the requirements of agenda items under consideration. The Commission will not normally meet on Mondays or Fridays.

OPEN MEETING - THURSDAY, DECEMBER 9, 1982 - 10:00 A.M.

The subject matter of the December 9 open meeting will be:

(1) Consideration of whether to approve a proposed rule change submitted by the Cincinnati Stock Exchange, Inc. (CSE) which would terminate the experimental status of the CSE's National Securities Trading System by authorizing that System to operate on an indefinite basis and removing the 200 issue limit on the number of securities which may be traded in the System. COMMISSION ANNOUNCEMENTS

ANDREW E. GOLDSTEIN APPOINTED ASSOCIATE REGIONAL ADMINISTRATOR

Donald N. Malawsky, Regional Administrator of the New York Regional Office, announced the appointment of Andrew Goldstein as Associate Regional Administrator. Mr. Goldstein's responsibilities will include the direction of the New York Regional Office's enforcement program.

Mr. Goldstein, a member of the New York Bar, graduated from Adelphi University in 1968 and received a Master's Degree in History in 1970. He graduated from Brooklyn Law School, where he was a member of the Law Review, in 1974. After working in the legal department of a brokerage firm in New York, he joined the staff of the Commission's New York Regional Office in September, 1975. Mr. Goldstein has previously served as a Branch Chief in Enforcement and an Assistant Regional Administrator.

ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

PUBLIC ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS INSTITUTED AGAINST JUDITH BRILES & CO.

Public administrative proceedings have been instituted against Judith Briles & Co. of Palo Alto, California, a registered broker-dealer and investment adviser, and Judith Tuthill Briles, the firm's president and owner.

The Order for Proceedings alleges that between August 1980 and June 1981, Briles wilfully caused the broker-dealer to file several monthly FOCUS reports and an annual audited report with the Commission that falsely stated the firm's net capital in that these reports failed to disclose a \$25,000 liability of Registrant. It is also alleged that the firm violated the broker-dealer net capital and record-keeping provisions under the Securities Exchange Act of 1934.

A hearing will be scheduled by further order to take evidence on the staff's allegations and to afford Registrant and Briles an opportunity to offer any defenses thereto, for the purpose of determining what remedial action, if any, should be ordered by the Commission. (Rel. 34-19285)

INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

PITTSBURGH NATIONAL DISCOUNT CORPORATION

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until December 27 to request a hearing on an application by Pittsburgh National Discount Corporation requesting an order, pursuant to Section 6(c) of the Investment Company Act of 1940, exempting it from all provisions of the Act. (collectively, the Funds), each registered under the Act as an open-end, diversified, management investment company, and the principal underwriter of the Funds, American Funds Distributors, Inc. (collective with the Funds, Applicants), exempting Applicants from the provisions of Section 22(d) of the Act and Rule 22d-1 thereunder to the extent necessary to permit sales of shares of the Funds at net asset value to directors, advisory board members, and employees of the Funds, employees of the Capital Group, Inc., and its subsidiaries, family members of such persons, and trusts primarily for the benefit of such persons. UNION-INVESTMENT-GESELLSCHAFT m.b.H.

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until December 27 to request a hearing on an application filed by Union-Investment-Gesellschaft m.b.H., a West German management company, on behalf of Unifonds, a West German mutual fund, requesting an order, pursuant to Sections 6(c) and 7(d) of the Investment Company Act of 1940, permitting shares of Unifonds to be sold in the United States, and granting exemptions from many of the provisions of the Act. T. ROWE PRICE NEW HORIZONS FUND, INC.

HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES

EASTERN EDISON COMPANY

An order has been issued authorizing Eastern Edison Company, subsidiary of Eastern Utilities Associates, to increase its preferred stock by an amount not in excess of \$15 million consisting of not in excess of 150,000 shares, par value \$100 per share. Eastern Edison will issue and sell such preferred stock by December 31, 1982 and use the proceeds to make a capital contribution to Montaup Electric Company, subsidiary of Eastern Edison. An exception from the competitive bidding requirements of Rule 50 has been granted. (Rel. 35-22748 - Dec. 2)

EASTERN UTILITIES ASSOCIATES

A supplemental order has been issued authorizing the terms and conditions of a negotiated public offering of 900,000 shares of common stock by Eastern Utilities Associates (EUA), a registered holding company. The order releases jurisdiction, previously reserved, over the terms and conditions of the negotiated common stock sale, the fees and expenses to be incurred in connection with the transactions and over capital contributions to Montaup Electric Company, subsidiary of Eastern Edison Company, subsidiary of EUA. An exception from the competitive bidding requirements of Rule 50(b) has been granted. (Rel. 35-22749 - Dec. 2)

CENTRAL AND SOUTH WEST CORPORATION

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until December 27 to request a hearing on a proposal by the Central and South West Corporation (CSW), a registered holding company, to issue and sell, during the period ending December 31, 1983, up to \$100 million of adjustable rate subordinated notes. The notes will be convertible, at the holder's option, into shares of CSW common stock at a rate equal to a certain number of shares for each note determined by a conversion price approximately equal to the market price per share on the date of issue of the notes. THE COLUMBIA GAS SYSTEM, INC.

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until December 27 to request a hearing on a proposal of The Columbia Gas System, Inc., a registered holding company, and certain of its subsidiaries, whereby the subsidiaries will issue and sell, and the holding company will acquire, installment notes in a maximum aggregate principal amount of \$185,700,000 and common stock aggregating \$19,100,000. The holding company will also make short-term advances to certain of its subsidiaries in a maximum aggregate principal amount of \$969,500,000. The proceeds of

these transactions will be used by the subsidiaries in connection with their construction and gas supply programs. Columbia proposes to issue and sell commercial paper and/or notes to banks aggregating up to \$525 million outstanding at any one time. NOTICE OF IMMEDIATE EFFECTIVENESS OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The National Association of Securities Dealers, Inc. has filed a proposed rule change which became effective under Section 19(b)(3)(A) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 (SR-NASD-82-26) to raise the service charge from \$15 to \$30 for individuals scheduled to take an exam who fail to keep their examination appointment or to cancel the appointment in a timely manner. Publication of the proposal is expected to be made in the Federal Register during the week of December 6. (Rel. 34-19289)
