SUBPART N OF PART 200 AMENDED

The Commission is amending Subpart N of Part 200 of 17 CFR Chapter II. Specifically, Section 200.800 is amended by: revising the OMB control number and expiration date for Rule 17Ad4(b) and (c); adding Forms N-7, S-4, N-14, F-4, ET, ID, SE, TA-2, N-SAR, N-3 and N-4, and Rules 2a19-1 and 26a-3; deleting Forms C-3, S-12, S-14, 2-MD, X-17a-12(1), X-17a-12(2), X-17A-16(1), X-17A-16(2), X-17a-17, N-1R, N-30A-2, N-30A-3, N-5R and N-1Q, and Rules 17a-12, 17a-16, 17a-17, 17a-20, 24b-2 and 48(b); and revising certain expiration dates in paragraph (b). ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

JAMES N. COOKE SANCTIONED

The Commission announced that in public administrative proceedings ordered under Sections 15(b) and 19(h) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934, James N. Cooke, formerly vice-president in charge of Corporate Finance for Laidlaw, Adams & Peck, Inc., submitted an Offer of Settlement which the Commission accepted. Cooke consented to Findings and Order Imposing Remedial Sanctions (Order) without admitting or denying the allegations contained in the Order Instituting Proceedings.

The Order finds that Cooke wilfully violated the antifraud provisions of the Securities Act of 1933 in connection with Laidlaw's due diligence investigation of Flight Transportation Corporation by obtaining money by making untrue statements of material fact or omitting of state material facts and engaging in certain transactions, practices or courses of business which operated as fraud or deceit upon certain purchasers.

The Order censures Cooke, suspends him from all association with any broker, dealer, investment adviser, investment company or municipal securities dealer for three months and requires him to submit his due diligence work for review, to an independent party, for six months following his suspension. CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

COMPLAINT FILED AGAINST JAMES NEWMAN

The Chicago Regional Office filed a complaint on February 27 in the U.S. District Court for the Eastern District of Wisconsin to enjoin James Newman from future violations of the antifraud provisions of the securities laws. The complaint alleged that from at least January 1982 to about October 5, 1984, Newman Companies of Wis., Inc. offered and sold unregistered securities in the form of secured and unsecured promissory notes to investors, raising approximately \$2 million from over 55 investors. The complaint further alleged that in connection with these sales, Newman, an officer and part owner of Newman Co. of Wis., made and caused to be made to investors material misrepresentations and omissions regarding the use of investor proceeds, the financial condition of Newman Co. of Wis. and the first mortgages on land collateralizing the secured promissory notes. (SEC v. James Newman, Wis., Civil File No. 86-C-0214, filed February 27, 1986). (LR-11025)

The Chicago Regional Office filed a complaint on February 27 in the U.S. District Court for the Eastern District of Wisconsin to enjoin Jerald Newman and Frank Manders from future violations of the registration and antifraud provisions of the securities laws, and Newman from future violations of the broker-dealer registration provisions of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934. The complaint alleged that from at least January 1982 to about October 5, 1984, Newman Companies Inc. offered and sold unregistered securities in the form of secured and unsecured promissory notes to investors, raising approximately \$11.4 million from about 800 investors in at least two states. The complaint further alleged that in connection with these sales, Newman and Manders, officers of Newman Co., made and caused to be made to investors material misrepresentations and omissions regarding the use of investor proceeds, the financial condition of Newman Co. and the first mortgages on land collateralizing the secured promissory notes. (SEC v. Jerald Newman and Frank Manders, Wis., Civil File No. 86-C-0215, filed February 27, 1986). (LR-11026)

INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

THE PRUDENTIAL VARIABLE CONTRACT ACCOUNT-11

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until April 11 to request a hearing on an application filed by The Prudential Variable Contract Account-11 for an order exempting it so that it, which serves as the underlying investment medium for certain group variable contracts, may use the amortized cost valuation method for the purpose of valuing short-term debt obligations. Under the proposed valuation system, Prudential will not maintain a stable price per share. (Rel. IC-14993 - March 17)

WITHDRAWAL SOUGHT

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until April 2 to comment on the application of MARSHALL INDUSTRIES to withdraw its common stock, par value \$1.00 per share (American Stock Exchange), and common stock, par value \$1.00 per share (Pacific Stock Exchange) from listing and registration. An order has been issued granting the application of the Midwest Stock Exchange for unlisted trading privileges in the common stock of the 11 issues which are listed and registered on one or more other national securities exchanges and are reported in the consolidated transaction reporting system. ACCELERATED APPROVAL OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The Commission approved, on an accelerated basis, proposed rule changes filed by: The American Stock Exchange, Inc. (SR-Amex-86-7) to extend its Issuer Choice Allocation Pilot Program through June 30, 1986. (Rel. 34-23000); and The Options Clearing Corporation (SR-OCC-85-18) enabling it to issue, clear and settle European-style Treasury bill options. (Rel. 34-23004)

NOTICE OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The Philadelphia Stock Exchange, Inc. filed a proposed rule change under Rule 19b-4 (SR-Phlx-86-9) to rescind Commentary .01(a)(i) of its Rule 1010 relating to the maintenance criteria for securities underlying listed options.

Publication of the proposal is expected to be made in the Federal Register during the week of March 17. (Rel. 34-23001)

APPROVAL OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The Commission approved a proposed rule change filed under Rule 19b-4 by the Boston Stock Exchange, Inc. (SR-BSE-85-9) to amend Chapter XIV of its rules of the Board of Governors to require that, in order to register as a BSE floor clerk, an applicant must pass the BSE Floor Member Examination. TRUST INDENTURE ACT RELEASES

CHRYSLER FINANCIAL CORPORATION

An order has been issued under the Trust Indenture Act of 1939 on an application by Chrysler Financial Corporation that the successor trusteeship of Manufacturers Hanover Trust Company under an existing indenture dated March 15, 1984 originally between Chrysler and Morgan Guaranty Trust Company and the trusteeships of Manufacturers under indentures dated December 15, 1983, January 15, 1984, June 15, 1984 and June 1, 1985 between Manufacturers and Chrysler are not so likely to involve a material conflict of interest as to make it necessary to disqualify Manufacturers from acting as trustee under any of such indentures.
