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## **ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS**

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### PROCEEDINGS INSTITUTED AND SANCTIONS IMPOSED AGAINST ARLAN I. PREBLUD

The Commission simultaneously instituted administrative proceedings and imposed sanctions against Arlan I. Preblud, of Denver, Colorado and former 98% shareholder and president of Otecenet S.A., a broker-dealer formerly having offices in Geneva, Switzerland and Denver, Colorado. Preblud consented to the findings and sanctions without admitting or denying the allegations.

The Commission found that Preblud violated the antifraud provisions of the securities laws in connection with participation by Preblud and Otecenet in the domination, control and manipulation of the market for the common stock of Balboa Exploration Company from at least January 1981 through May 1981, and also with Preblud's activity of bidding for and purchasing the common stock of Balboa while Otecenet was participating in the distribution of such shares. The Commission found that Preblud aided and abetted violations of the broker-dealer registration provisions in connection with the operation of Otecenet as a broker-dealer from at least February 1981 through June 1982 without its being registered as required under Section 15(b) of the Exchange Act.

The Commission's sanctions provide that Preblud be barred from association in any capacity with any broker, dealer, municipal securities dealer, investment adviser or investment company. (Rel. 34-23297)

### PROCEEDINGS INSTITUTED AGAINST REVLON, INC.

The Commission today instituted public administrative proceedings against Revlon, Inc. and accepted an offer of settlement in which Revlon consented to the issuance of an order by the Commission without admitting or denying the statements of fact or findings in the order.

The Commission found that Revlon violated certain tender offer disclosure provisions of the Federal securities laws by failing to amend promptly a previously filed Schedule 14D-9. The amendment disclosed that negotiations had commenced with Forstmann Little & Co. and Adler & Shaykin for a leveraged buyout and asset sale in response to a tender offer for Revlon by Pantry Pride, Inc., during September and October 1985.

Revlon was ordered to comply with the provisions of the Federal securities laws which the order found had been violated. (Rel. 34-23320)

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## **CIVIL PROCEEDINGS**

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### FREEZE CONTINUED AS TO ALVIN R. BROERMAN, OTHERS

The Chicago Regional Office announced that on June 4 Judge Grady of the Northern District of Illinois, Eastern Division, entered a Permanent Injunctions against Alvin R. Broerman, The Heritage Company and Pennington & Scott Enterprises; a Preliminary Injunction against Howard Levine; and an extension of the previously entered Temporary Restraining Order as to Barry Katz. These Orders enjoin the defendants from future violations of the registration and antifraud provisions of the securities laws and continue the freeze previously ordered by Judge Grady.

The May 27 complaint alleges that from about July 1985 to the present, Broerman, Levine, Katz, Pennington & Scott, Heritage and Frontier Enterprises offered and sold unregistered securities in the form of partnership interests in oil and gas wells to approximately 600 investors nationwide, thereby raising about \$4.5 million, and made material misrepresentations and omissions to investors.

The status conference is set for July 22 to schedule a hearing date regarding disgorgement, Preliminary and Permanent Injunctions as to Katz, and a Permanent Injunction as to Levine. (SEC v. Alvin R. Broerman, et al., Civil Action No. 86 C 3725, filed May 27, 1986). (LR-11126)

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## CRIMINAL PROCEEDINGS

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### MICHAEL J. HANNAN INDICTED

The Atlanta Regional and Miami Branch Offices announced that on May 22 a Federal grand jury of the Southern District of New York returned an 83-count indictment against Michael J. Hannan of North Palm Beach and Gainesville, Florida. The indictment charges Hannan with 15 counts of wire fraud and 68 counts of violating the antifraud provisions of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934. Hannan is the president of Institutional Capital Growth, Inc. is a registered investment adviser in North Palm Beach; was president of Island Resources, Inc., a New York corporation; and was general partner of TRADA, a Florida limited partnership.

The indictment charges that Hannan misappropriated or embezzled funds placed with him for investment, defrauded broker-dealers by failing to pay for securities purchased, and engaged in a fraudulent and manipulative scheme, utilizing wash sales, free riding and nominee accounts at 12 broker-dealers, to artificially raise and maintain the price of Island common stock and create a false and misleading appearance of active trading in the stock. The indictment charges that Hannan's manipulative activities were responsible, in part, for a rise in the market price of Island stock from 15 cents per share in March 1983 to approximately \$4.60 per share in March 1985. (U.S. v. Michael J. Hannan, USDC SDNY). (LR-11127)

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## INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

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### MUTUAL OF AMERICA LIFE INSURANCE COMPANY

An order has been issued exempting Mutual of America Life Insurance Company, Mutual of America Separate Account No. 2 (Account No. 2) and Mutual of America Investment Corporation (Fund) (collectively, Applicants), from the provisions of Section 17(a) of the Investment Company Act, and approving certain transactions to permit the reorganization of Account No. 2, a management investment company, into a unit investment trust issuing variable annuity contracts funded by the Fund. The order also exempts Applicants from the provisions of Sections 26(a)(2) and 27(c)(2) of the Act to permit the deduction of a mortality risk charge and a distribution charge. (Rel. IC-15140 - June 10)

### LAZARD SPECIAL EQUITY FUND, INC.

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until July 1 to request a hearing on the application by Lazard Special Equity Fund, Inc. for an order permitting the proposed purchase and sale of securities between it and a limited partnership and an individual account also advised by the Fund's investment adviser. (Rel. IC-15141 - June 10)

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## HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES

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### KENTUCKY POWER COMPANY

An order has been issued authorizing Kentucky Power Company, subsidiary of American Electric Power Company, Inc., to issue and sell short-term notes to banks and commercial paper to dealers in aggregate principal amounts not to exceed \$40 million outstanding at any one time. (Rel. 35-24124 - June 11)

### EASTERN EDISON COMPANY

An order has been issued authorizing Eastern Edison Company, an electric utility subsidiary of Eastern Utilities Associates, a registered holding company, to increase its capital stock by issuing and selling up to 150,000 shares of Preferred Stock, par value \$100 per share, and to issue and sell, in one or more series, from time to time, up to \$55 million aggregate principal amount of First Mortgage and Collateral Trust Bonds through December 31, 1986. 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## SELF-REGULATORY ORGANIZATIONS

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### APPROVAL OF PROPOSED AMENDMENT TO PLAN

The Commission approved a proposed amendment by the New York Stock Exchange, Inc., under Rule 19d-1(c)(2), adding violations of NYSE Rule 412 (Customer Securities Account Transfers) to the list of minor rule violations reported under the plan. (Rel. 34-23317)

### APPROVAL OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The Commission approved a proposed rule change submitted by the Chicago Board Options Exchange, Inc. (File No. SR-CBOE-86-10) which imposes participation responsibilities on CBOE market-makers who use the Exchange's Retail Automatic Execution System (RAES). The rule change also expands the classes of CBOE members who may elect to participate in RAES. (Rel. 34-23313)

Companies and individuals must report to the Commission within ten days on Schedule 13D if after the acquisition of equity securities of a public company their beneficial interest therein exceeds five percent. Persons eligible to use the short form (Schedule 13G) may in lieu of filing a Schedule 13D file a Schedule 13G within 45 days after the end of the calendar year in which the person became subject to Section 13(d)(1). Companies and individuals making a tender offer must have on file at the time the tender offer commences a Schedule 14D-1.
