NOTICE OF COMMISSION MEETINGS

CHANGE IN THE MEETING: RESCHEDULING

The following open item scheduled for Thursday, July 24 at 2:30 p.m., has been re-scheduled for Thursday, August 7 at 10:00 a.m.:

Consideration of whether to authorize publication of a release requesting comments on the rulemaking petition submitted by the Securities Industry Association. The petition, as supplemented, proposes that the Commission adopt a rule that would allow a written confirmation of a securities purchase to be sent to investors in registered public offerings prior to the time a prospectus that meets the statutory requirements of the Securities Act of 1933 is delivered to them. Currently, a confirmation must be preceded or accompanied by a statutory prospectus. FOR FURTHER INFORMATION, PLEASE CONTACT Brent H. Taylor at (202) 272-2434.

ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

RULE 2(e) PROCEEDING INSTITUTED AGAINST WILLIAM GELFOND

The Commission issued an Order Instituting Proceedings and Opinion and Order under Rule 2(e) of the Commission's Rules of Practice against William Gelfond, a certified public accountant licensed by New Jersey. The Opinion and Order permanently denies Gelfond the privilege of appearing or practicing before the Commission. Gelfond is permitted to apply to resume such appearance or practice after five years provided that he has enrolled in courses, he is a member of the SEC Practice Section of the AICPA, and his work before the Commission would be reviewed in a manner acceptable to the staff of the Commission. Gelfond submitted an Offer of Settlement in which he consented to the Order without admitting or denying the findings therein.

The Order finds that Gelfond engaged in improper professional conduct within the meaning of Rule 2(e) in connection with his failure to conduct an audit of Worldwide Ventures Corporation's financial statements for the year ended September 30, 1984, in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards. JAMES ANTHONY LOCKHART BARRED

The Commission announced that in a public administrative proceeding, James Anthony Lockhart, an officer of C. & R. Pastor Securities, Inc., submitted an Offer of Settlement which the Commission accepted. Lockhart consented to an Order Making Findings & Imposing Remedial Sanctions which bars him from association with a broker, dealer, municipal securities dealer, investment adviser or investment company provided that he may apply for such association after three years from the date of the Order. The Order finds that Lockhart was permanently enjoined from further violations of the antifraud provisions of the securities laws in connection with his role at C. & R. Pastor Securities, Inc. (Rel. 34-23439)

CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

RALPH SPIGENER, M. F. COPELAND PERMANENTLY ENJOINED

The Fort Worth Regional Office announced that on July 8 Judge Tom Stagg entered orders of permanent injunction against Ralph Spigener of Homer, Louisiana, and M. F. Copeland, of Bernice, Louisiana. Both Spigener and Copeland consented to the orders without admitting or denying the allegations contained in the complaint, also filed on July 8, which charged them with violations of the registration, antifraud and broker-dealer registration provisions of the securities laws.

The complaint alleges that Spigener and Copeland offered and sold unregistered investment contract securities and made misrepresentations and omissions concerning the safety of the investment, source of returns, and existence of underlying timber option contracts. The complaint also alleges that neither Spigener nor Copeland was a registered broker-dealer at the time of the sales. (SEC v. Edward Ralph Spigener and Monroe Franklin Copeland, Civil Action No. CV-86-1489/USDC/WD/LA). (LR-11163)

MID-AMERICA ENERGY, OTHERS ENJOINED

The Chicago Regional Office announced that on July 7 Judge William C. Lee, U.S. District Court for the Northern District of Indiana, entered final orders of permanent injunction against Mid-America Energy, Inc., Rainelle Land Development, Inc., William E. Tully, and Stanley T. Hojnowski, enjoining them from violating the registration and antifraud provisions of the securities laws. Tully and Hojnowski were also enjoined from violating broker-dealer registration provisions. Each defendant was further ordered to account for all funds raised from the sale of securities. All defendants consented to the orders of permanent injunction without admitting or denying the allegations in the Commission's complaint.

The complaint alleged that from January 1981 to July 1985, the defendants had fraudulently sold \$1.7 million of unregistered limited partnership interests and investment contracts. (SEC v. Mid-America Energy, Inc., et al., Civil Action No. L-0078, NDIN, filed June 16, 1986). (LR-11164)

INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

MONARCH LIFE INSURANCE COMPANY

An order has been issued exempting Monarch Life Insurance Company, Variable Account B of Monarch Life Insurance Company, Bankers Security Life Insurance Society, Bankers Security Variable Annuity Separate Accounts P and Q, Centennial Cash Accumulation Fund, Inc., Centennial High Yield Bond Fund, Inc., Centennial Capital Appreciation Fund, Inc. and Oppenheimer Variable Life Funds (Fund) (collectively, Applicants) from the provisions of Section 17(a) of the Investment Company Act. The order also approves certain transactions to permit Centennial Cash Accumulation Fund, Inc., Centennial High Yield Bond Fund, Inc. and Centennial Capital Appreciation Fund, Inc. to transfer their portfolio assets and related liabilities to the Fund in exchange for shares of a corresponding series of the Fund. The order further exempts Applicants from Sections 9(a), 13(a), 15(a) and 15(b) of the Act and Rules 6e-2(b)(15) and 6e-3(T)(b)(15) to permit mixed and shared funding. (Rel. IC-15206 - July 16)

MOSELEY SECURITIES CORPORATION

A notice was issued on June 6 giving interested persons until July 7 to request a hearing on an application filed by Moseley Securities Corporation, formerly Moseley Hallgarten, Estabrook & Weeden, Inc., for a permanent order exempting Moseley and its affiliated companies from the provisions of Section 9(a) of the Investment Company Act. No requests for a hearing have been made. Therefore, as provided under Rule 0-5 of the Rules and Regulations under the Investment Company Act, the order requested by the application has been issued. (Rel. IC-15207 - July 17)

HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES

MUSTANG FUEL CORPORATION

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until August 11 to request a hearing on an application filed by Mustang Fuel Corporation (MFC), an Oklahoma corporation. MFC requests an order under Section 2(a)(4) of the Public Utility Holding Company Act declaring it not to be a "gas utility company". (Rel. 35-24151 - July 17)

ALLEGHENY GENERATING COMPANY

An order has been issued authorizing Allegheny Generating Company, subsidiary of Allegheny Power System, Inc., to issue and sell up to \$200 million of debentures through a negotiated offering as the initial step in providing permanent financing of its 40% interest in the Bath County (Virginia) Pumped Storage Project. Jurisdiction has been reserved over the terms and conditions of the issuance and sale. (Rel. 35-24152 - July 18)

UNLISTED TRADING GRANTED

Orders have been issued granting the application of the following stock exchanges for unlisted trading privileges in the common stock of the specified number of issues which are listed and registered on one or more other national securities exchanges and are reported in the consolidated transaction reporting system: Philadelphia Stock Exchange - three issues. (Rel. 34-23455) and the Midwest Stock Exchange - seven issues. (Rel. 34-23458)

SELF-REGULATORY ORGANIZATIONS

FILING AND IMMEDIATE EFFECTIVENESS OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The National Securities Clearing Corporation filed a proposed rule change (SR-NSCC-86-9) which became effective upon filing. The proposed rule change establishes a fee for the receipt of International Correspondent Delivery and Collection Service deliveries made through International Securities Clearing Corporation (ISCC) and to exempt ISCC from the delivery charges for those items. TRUST INDENTURE ACT RELEASES

UNION TANK CAR COMPANY

An order has been issued under the Trust Indenture Act of 1939 on an application by Union Tank Car Company that the trusteeship of Continental Illinois National Bank and Trust Company of Chicago under three Union indentures is not so likely to involve a material conflict of interest as to make it necessary in the public interest or for the protection of investors to disqualify the Bank from acting as trustee under these indentures.
