COMMISSION ANNOUNCEMENTS

INTERIM PROGRESS REPORT ON THE INTERNATIONALIZATION OF THE SECURITIES MARKET

The Commission transmitted an interim progress report on the accelerating internationalization of the securities markets to the House Committee on Energy and Commerce. The report describes recent initiatives undertaken by the Commission and its staff in the area of internationalization. (Press Release 86-64)

ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

SPOKANE BROKER SUSPENDED

The Commission instituted public administrative proceedings against Michael C. Talley and Company, Inc. (Company), a Spokane, Washington broker-dealer, and its president, Michael C. Talley. Simultaneously, the Commission accepted the Company's and Talley's Offer of Settlement in which the Company was censured and agreed to retain a compliance officer and to institute written procedures regarding markups, such procedures to be monitored by independent auditors for three years; and Talley agreed to be suspended from association with any broker or dealer for 12 months.

The administrative proceeding followed entry of a consent decree of injunction against the Company and Talley for violations of the antifraud provisions of the Securities Act of 1933 and the Securities Exchange Act of 1934. The injunctive action alleged manipulation and excessive markups in connection with the purchase and sale of securities of AJP Enterprises, Inc. and National Nonmetallic, Inc., two Washington corporations. CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

SPOKANE BROKERAGE FIRM ENJOINED

The Seattle Regional Office announced that on September 25 Michael C. Talley and Company, Inc., a Spokane broker-dealer, and its president, Michael C. Talley, were enjoined by the U.S. District Court at Spokane, Washington, from violations of the antifraud provisions of the securities laws. The Company and Talley consented to the Judgment without admitting or denying the violations alleged in the Complaint. The Judgment further required the Company to disgorge \$50,000 and Talley to disgorge \$150,000, as directed by the Commission.

The Complaint alleged that the Company had charged excessive markups and manipulated the market for the stock of two companies for which the Company had served as underwriter during an initial public offering. The Complaint also alleged that the Company had engaged in prohibited transactions by purchasing stock of the companies while engaged in a distribution of the stock. (SEC v. Michael C. Talley, et al., USDC EDWA, File No. C-86-805-JLQ). (LR-11265)

RONALD WALKER CONSENTS TO INJUNCTION

The Commission announced that on October 22 Ronald R. Walker consented to a permanent injunction enjoining him from future violations of the antifraud provisions of the Securities Act of 1933 and the Securities Exchange Act and from violations of the registration provisions of the Securities Act. Additionally, Walker agreed to be enjoined from aiding and abetting violations of the periodic reporting and recordkeeping-internal controls provisions of the Exchange Act. Walker was a Director and Executive Vice President of The Midwestern Companies, Inc. from May 1981 through May 1983 and a Director and President of Midwestern from May 1983 until May 1984.

In its Complaint, the Commission alleged, among other things, that Walker participated in the preparation, filing with the Commission and dissemination to shareholders and others of materially false and misleading periodic reports and financial statements of Midwestern for the year ended December 31, 1982 and the first three quarters of 1983. The Complaint further alleged that Walker violated the antifraud provisions by effecting transactions in Midwestern's stock while in possession of material, nonpublic information concerning Midwestern. (SEC v. Ronald R. Walker, et al., USDC WDMO, Civil Action No. 86-0523-CV-W-6). (LR-11267)

INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

OVERLAND FUNDING, INC.; N.W. ACCEPTANCE CORP.

Orders have been issued exempting Overland Funding, Inc. and N.W. Acceptance Corp. from all provisions of the Investment Company Act. (Rel. IC-15361; IC-15362 - Oct. 16)

DAILY MONEY FUND

An order has been issued on an application by Daily Money Fund and other funds (Funds), each of which is or will be advised by Fidelity Management and Research Company, exempting the Funds from Section 12(d)(3) of the Investment Company Act to permit each Fund to invest in the equity and convertible debt securities of certain Japanese broker-dealer securities companies whose shares are listed on the Tokyo Stock Exchange. HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES

THE SOUTHERN COMPANY

An order has been issued authorizing The Southern Company (Southern), a registered holding company, and its subsidiary, Southern Company Services, Inc. (Services), to acquire the common stock of two non-affiliated off-shore companies for a total investment in each of up to \$5 million in order to obtain liability insurance from such companies' subsidiaries. Jurisdiction is reserved over a proposal by Southern and Services to acquire for the same purpose shares of other companies for a total investment not exceeding \$10 million, pending completion of the record. SELF-REGULATORY ORGANIZATIONS

NOTICE OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGES

Proposed rule changes have been filed by: The Pacific Stock Exchange (SR-PSE-86-21) to permit the vocalization of bids or offers specifying a required minimum number of options contracts. (Rel. 34-23711); and The Philadelphia Stock Exchange (SR-Phlx-86-33) to increase fines for violations of rules relating to order and decorum on the trading floor, to prohibit firearms and use of another person's exchange identification, and to provide for referral of certain violations to the Business Conduct Committee. (Rel. 34-23717)

Publication of the proposals are expected to be made in the Federal Register during the week of October 20.

TRUST INDENTURE ACT RELEASES

LTV CORPORATION

An order has been issued under the Trust Indenture Act of 1939 on an application by LTV Corporation that the trusteeship of Texas American Bank/Dallas as successor trustee under four LTV indentures is not so likely to involve a material conflict of interest as to make it necessary in the public interest or for the protection of investors to disqualify Texas from acting as trustee under the indentures.
