COMMISSION ANNOUNCEMENTS

SEC CHAIRMAN TO MEET WITH PRESS

David S. Ruder, Chairman of the Commission, will be available to meet with the press on Friday, May 19 in New York City, following a noontime address to the Women's Economic Forum. The Women's Economic Forum is being held in the Jade Room of the Waldorf Astoria Hotel in New York City.

The topic of Chairman Ruder's speech will be the steps that have been taken to address liquidity and volatility in the securities markets and what remains to be done to ensure orderly and efficient markets in the wake of the October 1987 market break. Recently, Chairman Ruder has also spoken on world-wide efforts to increase the efficiency of clearance and settlement systems, and on Commission initiatives in regard to disclosures in the management's discussion and analysis section of financial statements. STEADMAN COMPLEX OF INVESTMENT COMPANIES REDEMPTION SUSPENSION

The Commission issued an Order temporarily suspending the right of redemption of the shares of Steadman Financial Fund; Steadman Investment Fund; Steadman Oceanographic, Technology & Growth Fund; Steadman American Industry Fund; and Steadman Associated Fund (Steadman Funds) for 30 calendar days.

The Order states that based on an investigation by the staff, it appears that it is not reasonably practicable for the Steadman Funds to determine the value of their net assets. The Boards of Trustees of the Funds have requested that the Commission issue an Order suspending redemptions of the Funds. The Commission issued the Order because it believes that a suspension of the right of redemption of the Steadman Funds' outstanding redeemable securities, as well as payment for shares submitted for redemption for which payment has not yet been made, is necessary for the protection of security holders of the Steadman Funds. ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

FINDINGS AND SANCTIONS AGAINST LEONARD S. BERMAN

The Commission announced that Leonard S. Berman, a former registered representative with Kobrin Securities, Inc., a currently inactive broker-dealer, consented to an Order barring him from association in any capacity with any broker, dealer, investment company, investment adviser, or municipal securities dealer. The Commission found that Berman pleaded guilty to and was convicted of obstruction of justice in attempting to persuade a witness to give false testimony before the Commission staff, in violation of 18 USC §1505 in U.S. v. Berman, Cr. No. 86-375 (DNJ). Berman was sentenced to five years incarceration, which was suspended, and three years probation. (Rel. 34-26808)

TRADING SUSPENSIONS

TRADING SUSPENDED IN THE SECURITIES OF OMNI USA, INC., OTHERS

The Commission announced the single ten-day suspension of over-the-counter trading in the securities of Omni USA, Inc., American Investor Systems, Inc., Financial Broadcasting Network, Inc., Uni-Vite, Inc., and Moorgate, Ltd., for the period beginning at 9:30 a.m. (EDT) on May 17 and terminating at 11:59 p.m. (EDT) on May 26.

The Commission suspended trading in the securities of these issuers because of the lack of current, adequate and accurate public information about the beneficial ownership and control of each of these issuers' stock and possible unregistered distributions of the securities of these issuers by affiliates of each of these issuers; and in view of questions that have been raised about the adequacy and accuracy of publicly disseminated information concerning these matters. CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

GEORGE F. PAVARINI AND THE PAVTEC HEDGE FUNDS ORDERED TO DISTRIBUTE ASSETS

On May 2, U.S. District Court Judge Louis L. Stanton, Southern District of New York, issued an Opinion and Order in SEC v. George F. Pavarini, Pavtec Hedge Fund, and Pavtec Hedge Fund II, ordering that disgorged assets of defendants be distributed to defrauded investors in the Pavtec Hedge Funds and defrauded law clients of Pavarini's on a pro rata basis, in accordance with defendants' plan for distribution of assets, to which the Commission did not object. The distribution of assets was sought by the Commission in a Complaint filed on July 14, 1988 alleging that Pavarini defrauded investors by misrepresenting Pavtec profits, failed to register as an adviser, and commingled Pavtec and personal funds; Pavtec failed to register as an investment company; and Pavarini and Pavtec sold unregistered securities.

The Court denied the objection of the Clients' Security Fund of the State of New York, subrogee of Pavarini's law clients, that the claim of the law clients was superior to that of the investors. The Court agreed with the Commission's position that the law clients did not have a constructive trust in the disgorged assets, the Fund did not have a perfected lien on the assets, and the Fund did not have the benefit of New York State's prerogative right of preference over other creditors. (SEC v. George F. Pavarini, et al., SDNY, 88 Civ. 4897, LLS). (LR-12095)

CRIMINAL PROCEEDINGS

RICK N. HANSEN SENTENCED

The Denver Regional Office, the Salt Lake City Branch Office, and the U.S. Attorney for the District of Utah announced that on May 3 U.S. District Court Judge J. Thomas Greene sentenced Rick N. Hansen of Salt Lake City, Utah, to 12 months' imprisonment and to one year of supervised release as a result of his having entered a plea of guilty to a two-count felony Information.

The Information charged Hansen with one count of conspiracy to commit securities fraud, wire fraud, and bank fraud, and with one count of securities fraud relative to an FBI sting operation. Hansen was a stock promoter and an organizer in the scheme. Allegedly, Protecto Industries, Inc. was fraudulently revived. False financials were prepared, Protecto's stock was listed in the pink sheets, and the price of Protecto's stock was to be manipulated. The FBI operation has resulted in the indictment of three persons and in the entry of pleas to felony and misdemeanor informations by seven other persons. (U.S. v. Rick N. Hansen, USDC DUT, Central Division, Criminal Action No. 89-CR-0018G). (LR-12094)
