RULES AND RELATED MATTERS

COMMENTS REQUESTED ON PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO RULE 15c2-11

The Commission is requesting comments on proposed amendments to Rule 15c2-11, 17 CFR 240.15c2-11, under the Securities Exchange Act of 1934. The proposed amendments would require broker-dealers initiating or resuming quotations to (1) review the rule's specified information; (2) have a copy of any trading suspension order (or companion Commission release) issued for any security of the subject issuer (or its predecessor) during the preceding year; (3) clarify the specified information relating to reporting companies; (4) clarify the retention period for the specified information; (5) extend the period by which information must be furnished to the interdealer quotation system; and (6) clarify the exception for NASDAQ securities. The Commission is also soliciting comment on the rule's "piggyback" provision.

COMMENTS REQUESTED ON AMENDMENTS TO FINANCIAL RESPONSIBILITY RULES

The Commission is proposing for comment amendments to its Net Capital Rule. Under the proposed amendments, Securities Exchange Act Rule 15c3-1 would be amended to raise the minimum net capital required of registered broker-dealers and to standardize the deductions that broker-dealers incur in arriving at net capital for their equity securities positions. Furthermore, the amendments would establish a haircut for zero coupon bonds and relieve certain aggregate indebtedness charges.

COMMISSION ANNOUNCEMENTS

STAFF ACCOUNTING BULLETIN NO. 85

The Commission has issued Staff Accounting Bulletin No. 85 to express its views relating to (1) use of the gross revenue method of amortizing capitalized costs of oil and gas properties by entities using the full cost method of accounting, and (2) the inclusion of methane gas within the definition of proved oil and gas reserves. ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

PROCEEDINGS INSTITUTED AGAINST FORBES PORTFOLIO MANAGEMENT

The Commission instituted public administrative proceedings against Forbes Portfolio Management, a registered investment adviser, Thomas E. Bernhoft, its owner, and Glenn R. Hadland, an advisory representative, all of Tacoma, Washington, based on injunctions against them in the U.S. District Court for the Western District of Washington for, among other things, registration and antifraud violations of the Securities Act, Exchange Act, and Advisers Act. Simultaneously, the Commission accepted Offers of Settlement revoking Forbes' registration and barring Bernhoft and Hadland from association with any broker, dealer, municipal securities dealer, investment adviser, or investment company. It was alleged that approximately \$3,500,000 of investor funds raised by respondents were commingled and diverted from the investment purpose represented. (Rel. IA-1197)

CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

GSS VENTURE CAPITAL CORPORATION AND MAX, INC. PERMANENTLY ENJOINED

The Chicago Regional Office announced that on August 30 U.S. District Judge Milton I. Shadur, Northern District of Illinois, issued Final Judgments of Permanent Injunction against GSS Venture Capital Corporation and Max, Inc. by default. Defendants were permanently enjoined from violating antifraud and reporting provisions of the securities laws and were prohibited from disposing of any company assets or records until further order of the Court. Both were two of 16 defendants charged in the Commission's Complaint with engaging in a scheme to defraud that violated antifraud and other provisions of the securities laws in connection with the offer, purchase, and sale of their securities. Neither defendant filed an answer or otherwise pled in response to the charges made against them in the Complaint by the Commission. (SEC v. Kimmes, et al., Civil Action No. 89 C 5942, NDIL). ARNOLD KIMMES AND MICHAEL WRIGHT CONSENT TO PRELIMINARY INJUNCTIVE RELIEF

The Chicago Regional Office announced that on August 30 U.S. District Judge Milton I. Shadur, Northern District of Illinois, issued an Order of Preliminary Injunction and Other Equitable Relief against Arnold Kimmes. Kimmes consented to the Order, which expires on August 15, 1990, without admitting or denying the allegations of the Complaint which, among other things, charged Kimmes and 15 others with engaging in a scheme to defraud that violated antifraud and other provisions of the securities laws in connection with the purchase and sale of securities of GSS Venture Capital Corporation and Max, Inc. The order preliminarily enjoined Kimmes from violating the antifraud and recordkeeping provisions and also extended the freeze of Kimmes' funds and other assets with the exception of an allowance for preservation of assets, living expenses, and the payment of reasonable expenses for his defense in this case and other related civil and criminal cases. On August 18, Judge Shadur issued a similar order with respect to another defendant, Michael Wright, who consented to the relief as well without admitting or denying the allegations. (SEC v. Kimmes, et al., Civil Action No. 89 C 5942, NDIL). (LR-12249)

THOMAS QUINN PRELIMINARILY ENJOINED

The Chicago Regional Office announced that on September 1 U.S. District Judge Milton I. Shadur, Northern District of Illinois, issued an Order of Preliminary Injunction and Other Equitable Relief against Thomas Quinn. The Court found that Quinn had received proper notice of the preliminary injunction hearing and failed to either have someone appear on his behalf or to seek a continuance. The Court further found, after reviewing the legal memoranda, affidavits and exhibits the Commission filed, that the Commission produced a substantial amount of evidence which showed that it was far more than reasonably likely that the Commission will prove at a trial on the merits, among other things, that Quinn and other knowingly engaged in a scheme to defraud that involved artificially raising the price of the securities GSS Venture Capital Corporation and Max, Inc. through a variety of manipulative devices and knowingly used undisclosed nominees to buy and sell the securities of these two issuers. The order preliminarily enjoined Quinn from violating antifraud and recordkeeping provisions and extended the freeze of his funds and other assets until further order of the court. (SEC v. Kimmes, et al., Civil Action No. 89 C 5942, NDIL). (LR-12249)

LISTING, DELISTING AND UNLISTED TRADING ACTIONS

UNLISTED TRADING SOUGHT

A notice has been issued giving interested persons an opportunity to comment on the application of the Chicago Board Options Exchange for unlisted trading privileges in 500 stocks which are all reported in the consolidated transaction reporting system for the purpose of trading market baskets on the Standard & Poors 500 and 100 indexes. The UTP request includes 31 over-the-counter stocks which are not registered on any national securities exchange. The remaining 469 stocks are listed and registered on one or more other national securities exchanges. (Rel. 34-27237)

DELISTING GRANTED

An order has been issued granting the application of the American Stock Exchange to strike from listing and registration the common stock, \$1 par value, of DAMON CREATIONS, INC. (Rel. 34-27241)

SELF-REGULATORY ORGANIZATIONS

APPROVAL OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGES

The Commission approved a proposed rule change filed by: The American Stock Exchange (SR-Amex-89-10) that, among other things, narrows the bid-ask differentials for certain options quotations and requires specialists to make ten-up markets. (Rel. 34-27235); and The Chicago Board Options Exchange (SR-CBOE-89-13) to clarify the intent of the position limit rule. (Rel. 34-27240)

NOTICE OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The Chicago Board Options Exchange filed a proposed rule change under Rule 19b-4 (SR-CBOE-89-15) to provide more flexibility in the execution of multiple-part transactions (i.e., stock-option combination transactions). Publication of the proposal is expected to be made in the Federal Register during the week of September 18. (Rel. 34-27238)

IMMEDIATE EFFECTIVENESS OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The Chicago Board Options Exchange filed a proposed rule change which became effective immediately upon filing under Section 19(b)(3)(A) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934. The proposal (SR-CBOE-89-19) imposes fees for the leasing of trading booths on the CBOE floor. (Rel. 34-27239)

TRUST INDENTURE ACT RELEASES

DELTA AIR LINES, INC.

An order has been issued under the Trust Indenture Act of 1939 on an application by Delta Air Lines, Inc. that the trusteeship of Citizens and Southern Trust Company (Georgia), National Association under 18 Company indentures is not so likely to

involve a material conflict of interest as to make it necessary in the public interest or for the protection of investors to disqualify the Bank from acting as trustee under the indentures. (Rel. TI-2224)
