

To Whom it May Concern:

I am a lawyer who has specialized in the representation of investors seeking recovery of losses from the negligence and other wrongdoing of stockbrokers and broker-dealers for nearly 15 years. My office is located in South Florida and most of my clients are elderly and retired. The losses suffered by a typical client in many cases severely affects the ability of that elderly person to meet ordinary day-to-day living expenses. In many cases the ability to obtain needed medical treatment is hindered by the financial losses which they have suffered.

It is therefore imperative to afford these financially injured elderly persons a fair opportunity to pursue their legal remedies against the offending brokers and broker-dealers.

On May 4, 2006 the NASD stated on its website that it had filed Amendment No5 to the code rewrite, Filing 2003-158, This filing includes substantial changes from the last amendment to the rewrite which will materially affect investors.

Based on the scores of comment letters already received on the rewrite it is clear that this is an area of great concern to the public. I therefore ask that the SEC commence a new comment period to allow public input on this important new filing.
