CORRECTION

In the Federal Register of October 26, 2015 in FR Doc. 2015-27069, on page 65274, subsection (iii) of footnote 5, change the text, "amend proposed Rule 7.16P(f)(5)(C) to clarify that the Exchange would treat all odd lot orders ranked Priority 2 – Display Orders in the same manner as Market Orders and other non-displayed orders," to the text, "remove references to odd lot orders in proposed Rule 7.16P(f)(5)". On page 65276, in the 4th sentence of paragraph 3,

remove the following language: “of odd-lot orders that are ranked Priority 2,”. On page 65277, in the 1st sentence of the first full paragraph, change the text, “amends proposed Rule 7.16P(f)(5)(C) to clarify that the Exchange would treat all odd lot orders ranked Priority 2 – Display Orders in the same manner as Market Orders and other non-displayed orders,” to the text, “remove references to odd lot orders in proposed Rule 7.16P(f)(5)”
