

Christian Leuz, Professor of Accounting and the David G. Booth Faculty Fellow at the Graduate School of Business of the University of Chicago. He is also an Executive Board Member of the Initiative on Global Financial Markets, a Research Associate at the European Corporate Governance Institute and a Fellow at Wharton's Financial Institution Center. His research examines the role of corporate disclosures, accounting transparency and disclosure regulation in capital markets, corporate governance and corporate financing. His most recent publications have appeared in the *Journal of Accounting Research*, *Journal of Financial Economics*, and *Journal of Accounting and Economics*. He has received several grants and honors, of which the Geewax Terker Prize is the latest. Professor Leuz is an associate editor for the *Journal of Accounting and Economics* and serves on the editorial board of *The Accounting Review*, the *Journal of Accounting Research*, the *Journal of Business, Finance and Accounting*, and the *International Journal of Accounting*.

Born in Germany, Professor Leuz earned his doctoral degree and "Habilitation" at the Goethe University Frankfurt in Germany. Prior to this position, he was the Harold Stott Term Assistant Professor in Accounting at the Wharton School of the University of Pennsylvania and a visiting doctoral fellow at the Simon School of Business, University of Rochester.
