David L. Shedlarz is vice chairman of Pfizer Inc. He serves as a member of the Pfizer Executive Committee which is the company's most senior decision-making team, responsible for vision, strategic direction and operations of the company. This team reviews and approves all major management, operating and financial decisions. This committee has direct control over, and accountability for, the performance of nearly all Pfizer operating and support groups. Mr. Shedlarz also focuses on three of Pfizer's most critical levels for sustaining competitive advantage – our human resources, our financial resources, and our enterprise-wide information technologies.

Mr. Shedlarz joined Pfizer in 1976 as a senior financial analyst in the Pharmaceutical Division. Following a series of positions of increasing responsibility, including service as financial manager and controller of Marketing/Sales/Production, Diagnostics Division, he was promoted to production controller of the U.S. Pharmaceuticals Division in 1979. He was appointed assistant group controller, U. S. Pharmaceuticals Division, in 1981. In 1984 Mr. Shedlarz assumed responsibilities as group controller and was promoted to vice president of Finance of the U.S. Pharmaceuticals Group in 1989. He became an elected corporate officer and vice president of finance, Pfizer Inc, in 1992. He was named chief financial officer in 1995 and assumed added responsibilities as senior vice president of the company in January 1997. He was named executive vice president in May 1999 and vice chairman in March 2005.

Mr. Shedlarz is heavily involved in the community. He is a board member of National Junior Achievement and is a board member and chairman of Junior Achievement of New York. He is also a member of the National Multiple Sclerosis Society Board, the Pitney Bowes Board, the NYU Stern School Board of Overseers, the J.P. Morgan Chase & Co. National Advisory Board, the Corporate Executive Board's Working Council for CFOs, the Partnership for Public Service, Financial Executive International, the National Association of Manufacturers Board, co-chair of the Principle Financial Officers Committee at the Business Roundtable, a member of the International Accounting Standards Board and the Standing Advisory Group of the Public Accounting Oversight Board.

Mr. Shedlarz earned his M.B.A. in finance/accounting from Stern School of Business, New York University in 1975 and his B.S. in economics/mathematics from Oakland/Michigan State University in 1970.
